After the tour we will go back to the Strathalbyn Road to turn left into Bull Creek Road to Ashbourne, where we will have lunch at the Greenman Inn.



HMVC LIBRARY NEWS April 2025




THANKS to the continuing generosity of Club Members, the Library has a number of very interesting items to review. Two such were mentioned at the February General Meeting, and I can now advise that they are available for loan. The first, is an 'expose' on the inventor, Paul Sarich, and his ground-breaking (at that time) 'Orbital motor', by well known and respected automobile enthusiast, Pedr Davis. The motor, as fitted to vehicles produced in the 1970's-80's, produced some exciting possibilities. Readers will ask, then, what went wrong and why wasn't the motor adopted by the car builders at the time? The book doesn't offer reasons but argues that the concept, as tested, opened a rare opportunity for a local manufacturer to produce a vehicle, at least motor-wise, far ahead of its competition. Judge for yourself!

DAVIS, Pedr. SARICH, the man and his engines. On the Display Shelf now, then later in the Library at 92/SAR.

Another book which will appeal especially to the motor cycling Members is the 'Adventure Motorcycling Handbook'. Any owner/rider considering a

longish overseas trans-continental m/c tour must read this book! It clearly recommends what to take and what to leave behind, pre-trip medical vaccinations, the all-important documentation to be carried at all times, how to deal with various border officials, where to seek assistance (country by country), and a wealth of hard-won practical advice! Even if you are an arm-chair m/c traveller, you will love this book.


Finally, a book which may appeal to those 'vaguely' interested in building an electric car! It looks at the vast history of the electricpowered vehicles,

(then, mainly by lead-acid batteries), and what had been achieved at the time of publication. But it does illustrate that many older cars can be transformed and powered, economically, by electricity. Sure, a lot has happened since this book was published but it still serves as an <u>introduction</u> to the everchanging EV world!



1st Light Car Patrol

A group of Melbourne motoring enthusiasts donated cars for the newly formed, (15th August 1914), 1st Australian Imperial Force, (AIF).

They and their cars became the 1st Light Car Patrol in June 1916, designated as the 1st Armoured Car Section.

The cars were a 50hp DAIMLER, a 60hp MERCEDES and a 60hp. MINERVA; and they sailed on 20th June 1916, bound for Egypt.

ALL BRITISH DAY ECHUNGA OVALS Sunday 2nd March 2025

The background to car badges



Audi

The Audi badge of four rings symbolically represents the four companies that merged in 1932 in the Saxony region of Germany to form Auto Union AG. The four were Audi, DKW, Horch (pronounced "Hawk") and Wanderer.

The roots of Audi stretch back to 1899 when August Horch founded A. Horch & Cie in Cologne. When he left to start his own company, due to copyright issues he couldn't use his own name so he opted for "Audi", the Latin translation of "Horch", meaning "to listen".



Before World War II, the badge was only used on Auto Union racing cars, while the member companies continued to use their own names and emblems. Each ring has a different meaning: Audi's represents progress and innovation; DKW is about ingenuity; Horch represents luxury; and Wanderer embodies the spirit of exploration. (*Sounds like a graphic designer's explanation to me!*) The company is now based in Ingolstadt, Bavaria and is a subsidiary of Volkswagen.

"No longer another glorious Australian failure" ...

S was reading a copy of *Classic and Sports Car* from the early 2000s—I really don't like the term "the noughties"—and had to laugh when the Leyland Force 7 Coupé was quoted as "no longer seen as just another glorious failure – like Gallipoli". A reader wrote in and declared that nearly all Australian automotive failures were either English, or English-derived. He then explained that his parents always carried a can of WD-40 in BMC front-wheel drive vehicles; Triumphs were the victims of a disastrous fuel injection system; and Jaguars would begin to rust after a year. The Leyland P76 and Force 7 Coupé had significant potential, ruined by under-capitalisation and disastrous industrial relations. And perhaps someone should point out that the Gallipoli farce was the result of decisions made far from Australia—and by people who weren't Australian!

Another forgotten marque

S o many car brands have come and gone that a friend and I love playing a game where we try and think of as many, (and the more obscure the better), brands starting with each letter of the alphabet. One that disappeared in 1962 was the Grégoire company, based in Asnières in the Seine region of France. It wasn't a long history, having started when visionary engineer Jean Albert Grégoire started the company just after World War II. Output included a lightweight concept taking the chassis from the Amilcar to produce an all-aluminium small saloon which evolved into the Panhard Dyna, the front-wheel drive Hotchkiss-Grégoire, (with a 60bhp two-litre flat four), and a gas turbine concept with electro-magnetic transmission brake and a supercharged two-litre GT in 1956 (*at right*), of which only a few sold. The company folded, but Jean Albert went on to build a front-wheel drive electric car in the 70s.

Editor's Note:

Automobile Grégoire, 1902–1924, established by Pierre Joseph Grégoire, built cars like this 1909 Raceabout. He and Jean Albert were not related.

Minutes of General Meeting No 598: Held on Thursday 6th March 2024. No discussion from the floor. Motion to accept the previous minutes proposed by: Malc Haythorpe, Seconded by: Leigh Blacket. Motion Approved. President's Report: (Steve Hall).




