Federation Report by Alan Jolley for General Meeting held 11.04.2024

Alan attended the February meeting of Federation and around 100 clubs were represented.

1. Federation would like to hold a meeting in Horsham in future
2. Re Bendigo Swap Meeting
 - (a) Public address system needs to be and will be upgraded in future
 - (b) Catering was found wanting and will be expanded for the 2024 Swap
 - (c) Payment by card was difficult and slow when renewing site fees for 2025.

The heavy internet traffic exceeded the Optus tower load.

- (d) more options for drinking water are needed
 - (e) operating costs for the swap exceed \$185K so its a big undertaking needing substantial financial reserves.
 - (f) the entry fee for 2024 swap will increase to \$20
2. AHMF (Australian Historic Motoring Federation) are working with other bodies to ensure that fuel will continue to be available for our vehicles in the future.
 3. Federation is talking to VicRoads about limiting fees for number plate retention.
 4. Grants for young restorers are available through the Robert Shannons Trust,

 6. A number of club grants were dispersed in 2024
 7. National Motoring Heritage Day is on May 19th 2024 and Federation is encouraging all member clubs to engage with the community and hold public celebrations.

This was built in the late 1800's to provide irrigation for dairy Orchards in the Dooen area.

All vehicles negotiated the several kilometres of '1920's unsealed road (read bush track !) and arrived safely. It was a nice sunny morning and very picturesque setting as we checked out the old weir.

Leaving there we headed back into town, meeting at May Park for a coffee/ice cream/chat before departing for home.

A most enjoyable outing for all – even though the Webbs had washed the Statesman before the run – and had to wash it again after !!

Veteran Car Club 1 & 2 Cylinder Rally in Echuca on 14th – 17th March

After carrying out maintenance & cleaning our 1908 Single Cylinder Swift Deluxe Roadster, we set off for the start of the Annual Rally in Moama. Arriving at 12.00, we joined many other Veteran Cars being unloaded & prepared for the next 4 days of touring. 74 Veterans had entered for the Rally. To add to the congestion of vehicles on the roads in the area, were over 400 Hot Rods & a large number of Holdens. The Holdens were there to take advantage of a final visit to The Holden Museum before its closure.

Our Rally began with a shake down tour around the area. We visited the Beer Shed & Heritage Farm Museum then on to the local Beach, where those who were game, were able to try Stand Up Paddle Boarding. There was a variation of talent on display, with a few people ending up in the river. Back to our accommodation where we enjoyed a Spit Roast dinner.

On Friday morning we met for briefing prior to the 100km. run. Rally Director warned of the only hill to be negotiated for the day was to get over the Murray River bridge. We believe it did cause some trouble for a few veterans as they held up the early morning traffic. Our first stop was at the Nanneella Estate Primary School for morning tea. The 25km. run took us about an hour. Our next short drive was along paddocks of ripe tomatoes which were being harvested & put into large containers ready for transport to the processing plant in Echuca. We arrived at the Girgarre Botanic Garden Café, where the vehicles were on display to the public while 140 entrants enjoyed a beautiful hot lunch. The next stop was another 25km. to Tongala, where we enjoyed an ice cream & then back to our accommodation. Our evening began by boarding the Steam Paddle Boat for a cruise down the Murray to the Radcliffe's Function Centre for our evening meal.

Our Saturday trip was out to the Torrumbarry Weir. Another perfect day for a drive along country roads, despite the head wind which was a challenge for our single cylinder. Our morning tea stop was a very novel idea. Identified as the Cattle Yards coffee stop, was simply a coffee van & a portable dunny set up at the end of a country laneway. Coffee & cake was quickly served with running boards providing a seat if need be. Back on the road again, arriving at the Torrumbarry Weir & Lock No. 26. Here we had plenty of time to chatter, admire the vehicles & check out the weir & its lovely shaded lawns & surroundings. One of the local rally entrants gave a very interesting talk on the weir operation, as he had worked there for many years. A beautiful gourmet finger food lunch was provided by a local caterer. Then it was time for the 50km trip back into Moama. After driving approx. 25km. the Swift stopped. Thinking it was a sooted up spark plug, we changed the plug & still no go. Further inspection found we had run out of fuel. As we had travelled a similar distance the day before with about 3 litres left in the tank, we didn't think we needed to check the fuel, despite passing a BP Service Station only a few k's back. After a ride back into Moama to pick up spare fuel, we were back on the road again. (It can happen to any of us Neville). Finally back into town to prepare for the Rally Dinner at the Bowling Club.

Sunday morning we gathered at the Historic Port of Echuca for a static public display. Our last drive for the weekend was a picturesque run to the 5 mile Picnic area on the Murray, a quick visit to St. Annes Winery & then onto the Rich River Golf Club for lunch & farewell. Congratulations to the Rally Directors Adam Auditori & David Provan for an excellently organised Rally.

Among the oldest vehicles was a 1899 De Dion Bouton, 1900 Victoria Combination, 1900 Locomobile Steamer & several motor buggies. The newest vehicle was a 1914 Humber and large collection of motorcycle. On a personal note, we rallied for four days and travelled a total of 275kms in our very reliable little Swift.

Of special interest is 1903 Carlton, pictured at the Dinner, believed to have originated from the Stawell & Nhill area and restored in Adelaide.

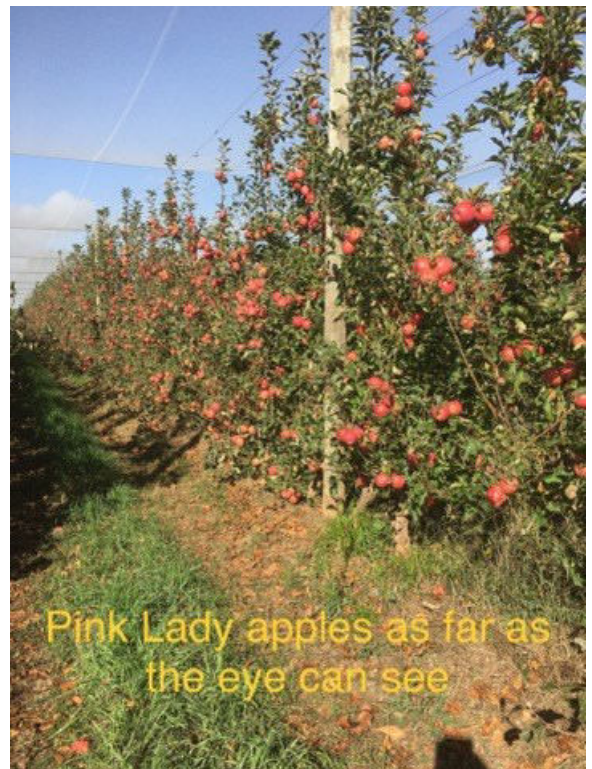

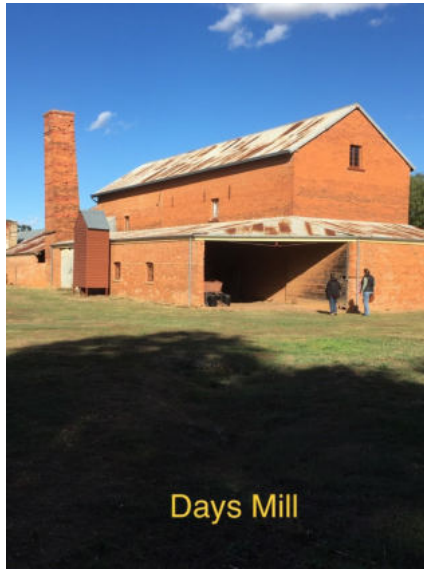

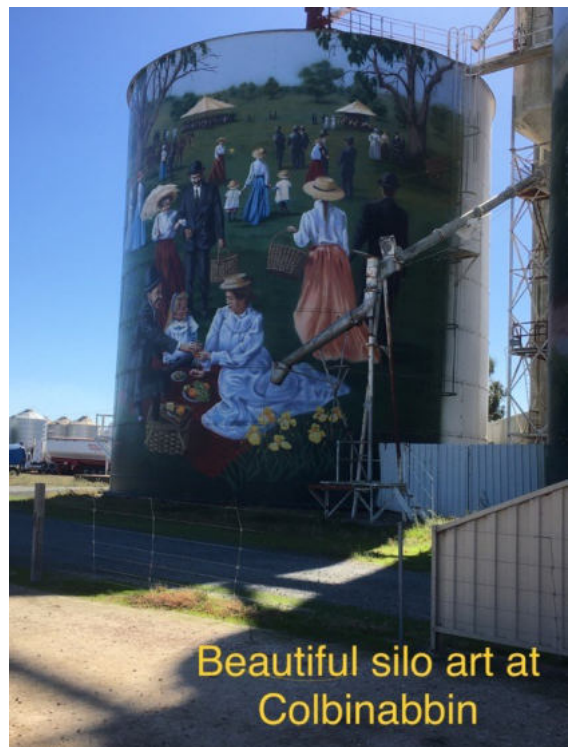
