Registrations are OPEN for the 2023 Mildura Easter Powersports Show & Shine

The Easter Powersports is a hallmark weekend for our region and the annual Show & Shine in the streets of Mildura City Heart welcomes very large crowds of people who come along to meet the Powersports competitors and look over their machines, setting the scene for an action-packed weekend of ski racing, arena motocross, speedway and drag racing. We also welcome back vehicle entertainment and activities for the whole family.

Having an exhibition space at the Show & Shine is a terrific opportunity for your club to gain excellent exposure and we are delighted that you have taken up the opportunity to join us.

Event Overview

Bump In: This will be between 6:00am and 8:30am. MCH event organisers will advise participants of specific bump in times closer to the event. No vehicles will be permitted to enter after 8:30am.

Event: Show & Shine from 9:00am to 1:00pm, all vehicles must remain STATIONARY during this time. Fines apply for moving before instructed by Event and Traffic Management.

Bump Out 1:15pm till 2:00pm. Local Laws will issue fines for any cars remaining after the roads have reopened.

All bump-in and bump-out will be overseen by Event Management and Traffic Management teams. MCH event organisers will supply the Club Event Marshall with an event run sheet at the Event Briefing.

Important Information for Club Exhibitors

Public Liability Insurance

All Clubs will provide a Certificate of Currency as provided by your insurer or insurance advisor. The Certificate of Currency must include the following:

- Indicate that cover is provided for the period of the event
- A minimum cover of \$20 million
- Describe the nature of the business (the description must match the nature of the activity you will be undertaking at the event)
- Indicate that the premium has been paid
- Coverage extends to events

Oil/Fluid Containment

Participants must manage all oil/fluid leaks from vehicles by using a drip tray, cardboard or other vessel when stationary. Clubs will be invoiced for any hazardous spills requiring cleanup post event.

Electrical Equipment

All electrical equipment is to be fitted with earth leakage circuit breakers and all electrical leads, tools and appliances must be inspected and tagged by a licensed electrical contractor prior to the event. Any exhibitor who does not comply will not be permitted to exhibit in the event.

Gas Cylinders

Must have a current stamp of approval.

Prohibited Goods

No glass is allowed on site.

Security and Safety

Exhibitors are responsible for adequately securing making safe their property and that of their staff and accompanying persons and the Mildura City Heart accepts no responsibility for damage, theft or injury.

Food / Food products

All food vendors contact admin@milduracity.com.au for eligibility details

To Confirm Your Club Participation

- Great communication skills
- Be reliable and punctual
- Be willing to get involved where needed
- Able to deal with problems in a cool and calm manner


What we can offer you:

New Vehicles for club permit scheme.

All vehicles must have a certificate of roadworthiness plus photos for club records and Vicroads.

Hard copy photos required of your car:

Front view

Rear view

Drivers position (Side on view with door open)

Passenger side


Drivers side

Body and Engine numbers, stampings and plates or VIN number

Present this information to the permit scheme officers, they will do the appropriate paperwork for Vicroads.

Also remember to keep your old logbooks for 12 months.



PSYCHE PUMPS

Psyche Pump Station was built in 1891 by the Chaffey brothers to meet the needs of the irrigation settlement. Water was pumped from the Murray River to Kings Billabong and then distributed throughout the area via a series of channels.

The steam-powered pump was replaced in 1959 by an electric pump. The original pump house still stands at Psyche Bend, complete with the restored original pump, and is the oldest pump configuration of its type in the world.

The steam-powered pump will be operating on Easter Sunday. Sunraysia Farmers

LANGTREE HALL MUSEUM

Langtree Hall was built in 1889 and was Mildura's first public hall. Originally in Langtree Avenue, over the years it has been used for a variety of purposes. Band recitals, concerts, operettas, and dramatic performances by local and visiting performers were an early feature. Langtree Hall is now situated at 79 Walnut Avenue and it was once called the 'Lyric Theatre'. Since being moved to its present location in Walnut Avenue, the hall has been restored and established as a privately-owned museum by the Cornell family. It has a stunning collection of district memorabilia. It is open Wednesday, Friday and Saturday 11am to 4pm




