Cover Story - My Daimler - Darren Miles

I grew up in Clunes - my family owned the local BP Garage in the main street - second generation. I'd often call in after school to catch a ride home but always managed to get a job serving petrol, cleaning up or washing cars, and often end up back home in time for tea after lock up. Many weekends were spent down there as well with

many hours working on Dad's 1929 Dodge which was in a corner in bits at that stage, and then later a '27 Oldsmobile tourer which we restored and eventually sold. I remember Kevin Holloway would sometimes call in to check on progress and have a chat to Dad. I guess this was when I got the bug for old cars.

We started looking for another car for club events other than the A Model, and remembered one of the cars that would come in for a service was a Mark II Jag. I was intrigued with the impressive wood grain dash, timeless gauges and toggle switches, and started following them at the Auctions. (didn't know about the oil leaks though, Frank W).


The Mark II Jags in reasonable condition were selling for a lot of money but I had noticed that the Daimlers, which appeared to be the same car, had been selling for half the price of the Jags and similar price to an early Holden or Ford being sold.

The Daimler Company had been bought out by Jaguar around 1962, and in short, used the Mark II body/platform and installed Daimler running gear - the motor being a V8 from the Daimler Dart SP 250, changed the bucket seats from the Jag to a split bench seat from the old Mark 1 and changed the grill to a fluted grill in Daimler styling. The car was now known as the Daimler 2.5 It. It had a top speed as tested when new of 112 MPH.

We came across a 1963 Daimler through a dealer in Melbourne approximately 5 years ago which had been

advertised on CarPoint and we ended up purchasing it. The previous owner who lived in NSW had passed away and his partner decided to trade it in. Over the seven years of his ownership, he installed Power Steering, Rack and Pinion Steering off a later model XJ6, air conditioning, electronic ignition and a set of chrome wire wheels.

Once we had the car home, we found transfer papers under the passenger floor mat belonging to the car from the old owner. We contacted her via mail asking for any history on the car they may have had. Elizabeth kindly replied some weeks later with a few photos of the car as they purchased it and the original receipt of purchase from Jouberts British Motors in Melbourne from new as well as the car's first registration papers (photo right). The receipts



showed the car costing £2,401 plus Sales Tax of £475. Registration was £16. Elizabeth also gave us a copy of the previous owner's registration papers which showed a Queensland address. When you Google search the Queensland address, you can see the Daimler sitting in their carport from 2007 until 2013.

Since our ownership, we've had an oil leak repaired between the heads, reconditioned the heads while they were removed, SU carbies have been reconditioned and a new starter motor installed.

It's a pleasure to drive and the small V8 sound - just nice. Owners, Louise, Jono & Darren Miles

Clubrooms Redevelopment Update #19

The months roll around quick enough, it is hard to believe this is report #19, a shorter report while we wait for some action further up the chain.

The outside structure, although at a standstill, has previously been paid for, and the structural steel was delivered to site. Given the delay, the committee felt it prudent to relocate and secure these materials. Mesh and Masonry (pictured right) kindly donated their forklift truck together with a driver to do the job. On the inside, the toilet layout has been updated, and we now have a revised set of plans.



The bills are still coming in, with the fire design mentioned last month now paid for, along with extending the hire of the temporary fencing, the hall hire at Ballarat North, Central Highlands Water, and the revised plans. The rent and rates from council have also been received, I will consider asking if these might be waived for the year, given the delay.

As previously reported, the holdup is the entitlement to use the land, and the formal issuing of the title for the allotment. This is sitting with the Surveyor General's Office for action. As requested by Council, I was able to compile a letter (see below) that was sent to the Surveyor General's Office to help expedite the process. This included some background on our club and our clubrooms, the project we have embarked on, the inconvenience of the delay, the costs being incurred, and whatever else I was able to think of.

I have now followed this up with Council who have sought further clarity from DEECA regarding where exactly the road closure is at with the Surveyor General's Office. It has been allocated to a surveyor (so is definitely being assessed). They are preparing a Survey Report and an OP Plan. As soon as they have this plan, they can publish a Gazettal and formally close the road.

So, although not there yet, this has progressed from last month's report, and I will keep on to it. Brett Holloway – on behalf of the Building Subcommittee

Road Discontinuance - Portion of Gladstone Street Road Reserve

The Vintage & Classic Car Club - Ballarat was formed in 1966, and is one of the oldest, largest and most active regional vehicle clubs in Australia. Since 1981 we have occupied a site at 620 Humffray Street South, on the corner of Gladstone Street, and have been fortunate to lease this from Council. For the last 40+ years, the Club has also been able to utilise the (unused) section of Gladstone Street between Humffray Street and the Yarrowee Creek as a car park, complementing access to our Clubrooms.

After discerning many options for facilities over many years, including relocation, the Club is embarking on a major redevelopment of our Clubrooms, a process that commenced in earnest early last year. We are investing heavily in our future and this project is fully self-funded.

The City of Ballarat have been very supportive of the process, and we have worked hard to be able to obtain Planning Approval. As part of this process, however, a tree protection zone of 12 metres was imposed, meaning we are no longer able to rebuild on the current site.

As part of the overall process, we were looking to secure the adjoining site and extend our footprint to utilise a portion of the Government Road, however in consideration of the tree protection zone, and in working with Council, it is now evident that to remain in the same location, the new facility will need to be constructed over the existing alignment of the road that is being discontinued.

We have worked with Council to formally discontinue the Government Road and requested that the Crown land be reserved for community use, consistent with the adjoining Yarrowee River Reserve, which is managed by the City of Ballarat. This has been approved by Councillors, and Council have been working with DEECA, who have been consulted and are providing support for the project. The formal closure of the road will also activate the space and increase our leased footprint.

With Planning Approval in order, the contents of the existing Clubrooms and all club property has been packed up, and this is stored in various locations.

We have held a farewell day to our Clubrooms of over 40 years (in April 2024) and demolished the existing ageing structure. We have levelled the site, dealt with the contaminated soil and prepared the base for the new building. The Club has ordered and paid for the new structure to be built. This has been delivered and we are now storing all of this in anticipation, at our cost, and at our risk. We have paid a deposit for the footings, paid for the windows, and

have the doors on order.

Running alongside this planning has been the statutory process, and it is our understanding that Council has ordered and paid for the surveying of the closed road, and that we will not have a new 'title' until the Survey Report is completed and a gazettal is published in the Victorian Government Gazette. We further understand the survey report is currently with the office of the Surveyor-General for action.

This is where we request your assistance, please.

Now that we are ready to proceed, the building surveyor has been appointed to the project. There are several points to be addressed, however the main issue is that they are not willing to issue a building permit until provided with the land title for all allotments.

DEECA are in a position to be able to place the notice in the Government Gazette, and provide a letter of consent as land owner, however this cannot take place until the Survey Report is complete.

So, our project is at a standstill. We are ready to commence erection; however, this is now on hold.

We are still incurring costs, and still paying for the redevelopment, yet we have lost our spiritual home. Meetings are presently being held in two separate locations, and we are paying rent for each of those places, and have just needed to extend this arrangement. There is also the safety of our members attending meetings at night in the dark, at unfamiliar premises with substandard parking arrangements. We are paying storage fees on the contents of the Clubrooms and club property. We were expecting this to be short term, but are now being inconvenienced and finding it difficult to easily access items needed, including those required on an annual basis e.g. trophy blanks for the upcoming AGM etc.

We have been paying for a site hut for the project, and have just extended the time (and cost) this will be required. Same with the temporary fencing that currently surrounds the site, this has been extended at a further cost to the Club.

Our Clubrooms site is integral to the Club, and to the success of the Club. It is our physical and spiritual home, the base for all activities. With a large number of members, and an ageing population, our Clubrooms are essential for social connectivity and social integration, and is crucial for social isolation of our older members, especially those who live alone after losing their loved one. We have one of the largest libraries of any similar club, and our members gather to read and borrow material, and crave the social interaction at the same time. However, this is unable to be accessed.

Our driving events start at the Clubrooms but are currently redistributed to an open car park somewhere in the city, which doesn't support the early cuppa and chat, and camaraderie that the club is famous for.

Our Club hosts many events at our Clubrooms, from fundraising morning teas for charity, through to visits from other groups, for which we cater for. Without the clubrooms, we are not able to provide this service, which means a drop in income. We rely on this income to fund our club activities, and to also enable us to fund this redevelopment.

We will soon be celebrating our 60th year since inception, and to not have our facilities finished will greatly diminish the meaning of this special event, an event not many car clubs will get to experience.

We expect and understand that your office has a process and workload to manage, but request that given our circumstances detailed above, and the timeliness of this project, respectfully request if you could expedite the process so that we can proceed with our dream facilities, an achievement to be proud of.

Thank you for your consideration, we look forward to our project progressing.

Restoration Roundabout (Trophy points) Sunday 17th August 2025

On a reasonable winter's morning, we gathered at the Selkirk Stadium and departed at 9.18. We travelled out to near Scarsdale where we visited new club member Keith Smith. Keith is a retired restorer of British sporting cars from the 1940's to 1960's. He had a couple of MGA's, an MGB and a Triumph Roadster on display in his workshop. He also had a couple of chassis, one rolling, in the very early stages of the restoration process. The paintwork on the restored cars is perfect and sprayed in the fresh air in front of his building.

We left Keith's place and travelled back into Delacombe to visit Mike & Lyn Simpson's shed and collection. First thing noticeable was how the door on the garage has been moved back a couple of metres, and the corner of the shed removed to improve access to the back yard where they have a 3 bay Ranbuild shed. Mike built a mezzanine floor for Lyn's Loft (She Shed) where she does her art painting and crafts. You have to use Lyn's Loft Lift to get up there - it is a platform on tracks lifted by an electric winch. And then there is the main floor. Done in epoxy resin, it is a swirl pattern in white, blue and black paint to create a unique effect. Plenty of posters and lighted signs around the lined walls including the feature Pink Floyd wall. The Cortina, Sunbeam, Executive and Mercury were also on display.

After our lunch break, we reassembled at Selkirk Stadium car park, then on Mike's instruction, we departed and headed across town to Mark Richmond's in Sebastopol. 
