

**Presidents Business:** As it was the last meeting for the year, Robin Fletcher thanked all the Committee members and Sub-Committee members for their years' work, which kept the Club operating. Robin also enquired if any Members had tiles that would be suitable to tile the BBQ area.


Over a million Murray Cod are produced each year for release in streams and lakes, plus at least half a million fingerlings of other species.

Many members reflected on the extraordinary standards set by male Murray Cod. After selecting and preparing a site to attract females to deposit eggs, the male custodian of this spot becomes its sole protector. He vigorously defends the eggs and the hatchlings ensuring they are sheltered and live in well oxygenated water mainly by the skilful use of his tail.
