By the time you read this, the hay that was cut off the club grounds will have been delivered to the Rochester


area in a convoy by some of our members and some truck club members.


Also this month we bid farewell to Andrew and Brigitte who are moving to northern Victoria for health reasons. We wish them well for the future.

Hay run to Rochester farmers

Saturday 25 - Sunday 26 March

We cut the club block at Darnum for hay, baling 37 rolls of hay.

Together with 40 bales donated by Bill and Nancy, Wayne, Carol and I joined the convoy of 11 semi loads of hay the Traf Truck Club carted to flood affected farmers at Rochester. In total 340 rolls of hay, all donated local hay, was distributed to 13 farmers struggling to recover from the Campaspe River flooding last year.

It was a real awakening to us to talk about and see the flood affected farms and farmers, and to find out how they coped with and are trying to recover from the floods.

Imagine walking into your shed and seeing your restored car collections all under water. Which car do you clean first or which engine do you drain first?

Your grass ready to mow for next years hay flat on the ground covered in mud and unable to be cut, forcing you to buy anything cows will eat. All the grass in your paddocks drowning, meaning your whole farm has to be resown next autumn.

After delivering the hay on Saturday afternoon we gathered to have tea and camp at the Rochester footy ground. The footy club cooked us and the supplied farmers a BBQ tea with drinks and we socialised with the farmers. Something we were told the farmers had not had the opportunity to do since the floods. A great night.

Sunday morning the footy club cooked us breakfast, after which we were able to head for home.

Some of us headed straight home, others via Elmore where we loaded with Oaten hay to bring back. So after a great weekend we returned home Sunday night.


Social Day at the Shed

front - rear - driving position (side on, door open)
passenger side - driver side - body and engine number stampings and plates
Permit registration renewals are to be signed by club signatories at <u>club meetings only</u>. Please do not approach them at their workplace or home, except in a pre-arranged emergency situation.

Club Signatories: Ross Watson or Rod Boreham (<u>club meetings only</u>) Please remember that club permit holders must always remain financial members of the club. Yearly membership fees need to be received no later than June 30.
