Cover Story – A Little Bit of History of Bridge Street Early Days

This one family-owned car has been in Ballarat all its life. Bought new at Wyres Bros Holden in 1955 by Fred and Mabel Walsh. The first generation were very proud and treated it with loving care until it was nearly worn out.

The second generation (son-in-law) started driving it at 16 when courting the daughter of the house. Eventually, the unlicensed driving was caught and a fine of Ten Pounds was levied (a week's wage). In this time, it participated in many "laps of Bridge Street" – the thing to do at nights and weekends.

These laps consisted of parking in Bridge Street and then "doing a lap" up Victoria Street and back down through Bridge Street (dodging the trams), and up Sturt Street to Lydiard Street, round and down again (with perhaps a bit of racing) to do it all again. I should mention here that Bridge Street then consisted of two lanes of parking, two lanes of traffic with a tram line up the centre. Unfortunately, this was all destroyed with the first incarnation mall. Perhaps it could return if common sense prevailed.

Clubrooms Redevelopment - Update #14

Where is the year going? March is done, daylight saving is ending, and Easter is upon us! April will be a slower month, due to the number of 'working' days missing - but they say "slow and steady wins the race" - and that is how we are proceeding at the moment.

Following on from last month, for statutory planning, the updated Energy Efficient report was commissioned (and received) and the amended plans were submitted (resubmitted) to Council. There was a response from Council that stated 'An Officer has undertaken a preliminary assessment of the application based on the information provided and has determined the application fees'. So, we know it is progressing when the fee schedule arrives! The need here was for the amended plans to be 'stamped' by Council to proceed.

And so, for the demolition, the endorsed ('stamped') plan has been received back. The VBA (Victorian Building Authority) have issued the Building Permit Number to the building surveyor for the Building Permit (Demolition). And the flow on is that our building surveyor has now issued the Demolition Permit!

With the demolition permit sorted, the demolition is next. The windows will be removed just before Easter, and the demolition will commence after Easter. The safe will need to be dealt with, and as it is encased in concrete, will need to hire a special jack hammer attachment to break it up for removal. The bricks will be removed and sent to be recycled/crushed. The stumps from the three trees on the verandah side will be removed at the same time. We will need a 'gate opener' during demolition, someone to open and close the gate(s) on the temporary fencing to allow access for trucks and equipment, whilst keeping the site secure.

Then for the 'new' side, the survey is still being completed, which will assist with the location of the building on site, the setout, floor levels, and for the retaining wall required on the south side.

For this retaining wall, plans have been drawn up by Tony and sent to the engineer, and when returned this will require a permit, although this can be stand alone. A materials list and works required is being prepared, and the pine posts along the drain will be removed in anticipation.

The production of the structure is moving ahead in the background. This is now fabricated and is off to the galvanisers. You know it is progressing when you receive an invoice for the progress payment (fabrication stage), in line with the schedule of works.

The Club has also established trade accounts with key suppliers around town (that have favourable trading terms and trade prices) that will be needed during the build, moreso when it comes to the fitout.

We will also need to establish a site hut - does anyone have a site hut that we can use for a short time? Required for a few months, between demolition and until the new building is at lockup.

And finally for this month, there is no further update on the lease at this stage. Council is waiting for a response from DEECA, I expect this will be linked with their formal site survey. I will check in and follow this up. Brett Holloway – on behalf of the Building Subcommittee



Concerning the 20 H.P Rolls Royce Cars 1922 - 2022 By David Davis & Ian Berg

Published in 2022 by the 20-Ghost Club, Australian Chapter to mark the Centenary of the Rolls-Royce Twenty 108 Pages

At its formation in 1947, the 20-Ghost Club was the first to take steps to create interest in the smaller, cheaper 20HP Rolls Royce Cars, the Twenty, and it is appropriate that the Club sponsor a book as a souvenir of the model's centenary. The smaller model was very popular in Australia as it was cheaper, smaller, easier to drive and service than the larger car. A total of 122 cars were sold new in Australia, 75 of which were the early three-speed model. Many of those early cars were bodied in Australia and in many cases re-bodied in the 1930's, due to the shocking roads which destroyed the original coachwork, even though the chassis continued to be fully serviceable.

While this local book has a distinctly Australian flavour, David Davis has endeavoured to present information regarding the Twenty, such as the origins of the smaller model, long-term ownership of Australian cars, the Rolls-Royce personnel who developed the

model, details of Australian bodywork and which company produced them. David has also produced the Twenty technical data, as well as the factory chassis cards, chassis plates, and depot service sheets, with mechanical changes made over the cars production.

Rolls-Royce Ltd produced 2912 of their Twenty model from 1922 to 1929. In 1998, Bob Clarke and Martin McCarthy – two Australian Twenty enthusiasts – published a list of known Australian Twenty cars and came up with 133 imported, but at that time, only 121 had survived.

lan Berg has also contributed substantially to the book, including the presentation of a fine portfolio of photographs of Australian Twenties, clearly showing the diversity of the imported and locally produced coachwork and early bodies, as well as their current bodies. It is estimated that 85% of Australian cars have survived, compared with only 44% of all 20HP Cars have survived worldwide. Australia, it seems, was kind to the Twenty! There is also a very detailed list of the Australian companies that built bodies on the imported Twenty chassis.

In 1922 the first Twenty to be imported into Australia was the 19th production chassis to leave the Rolls-Royce factory in Derby. Originally it was fitted with an Australian body as a

two door Smith and Waddington Saloon, which was modified to a four door Saloon in 1925. During the late 1930's, it was substantially modernised body wise. It was then purchased by David Davis, the co-author of this book in 1959. The car was then rebodied as a Tourer in 1963. There is a complete chapter on the maintenance and use of this car over sixty years here in Australia.

One of the last of the Twenty model cars produced in 1929 was originally bodied by Martin and King in Australia as a two door Saloon when new. It was then rebodied by Martin and King as a Coupe in 1937. The current body is a swept-tail roadster and is owned by Club Member Rick!

In the portfolio of Australian Twenty cars, there are 139 current cars and the third I am going to feature is a Hamilton Club car. This 1925 Model Twenty was fitted with a Barker English Tourer body and was the first production four-wheel brake and four speed gearbox 20HP and was used as the company demonstrator. In the book is a photograph of the car taken from the English Autocar Magazine of January 1926.

At some stage the car was sold to an American owner before being purchased by Chris and Rita White of the Hamilton Club in 2010. When we formed the Hamilton Club in 1970, Chris was a teenage schoolboy who was restoring a 1928 Austin 12 Tourer and he was one of the foundation members. Chris and Rita, years later, owned the Austin 12 Tourer AND an Austin 12 Sedan, as well as the Twenty Tourer. Both Austins are now back in Hamilton and Rita still has the Twenty, after Chris passed away some years ago. *Ron Gay*




