#### A WORD FROM OUR PRESIDENT KEN......

It has been good to see our runs being well attended lately. With the closure of the Red Robin Café in Camperdown, we had our first mid-month coffee with cars at the Cobden Miniature Railway. It's a great venue and we were very well looked after; and the scones, jam and cream were absolutely delicious! Thanks to Claudia and John and Julie and Chris for organizing our mid-week runs and evening dinners.

To finish off, I just wanted to bring up something that we all should be cautious of. It is probably coming to that time of year when some of our cars and motor bikes may not be driven/ridden for a period of time. We had what I believe was a very close call with the battery in our motorhome which is fitted with a normal lead-acid battery. As we sometimes experience with our vehicles over winter, we hadn't used our motor home for a couple of months. When we were in the shed yesterday, Sally walked past our motorhome and noticed a strong rotten egg smell and when we opened the passenger door, the smell was a lot stronger. Standing by the door you could hear a bubbling sound coming from under the van. The battery for the motor home is under the passenger side floor. I felt the floor and it was warm. We took out the floor mat and opened the lid to the battery box. The box was full of steam. You could also see steam being purged from the side of the battery and hear the acid bubbling away inside.

## **FROM OUR PRESIDENT (Continued)**

Concerned it might catch fire, or worse explode, we grabbed the fire extinguisher just in case. It seemed weird as nothing was running or switched on in the van. After disconnecting the battery, it was still bubbling away and steam was still coming out of the purge valve. Not wanting our motorhome to catch fire we covered the battery with a towel in case it exploded, and took it out of the van to an open area outside where it continued to vent for several hours. Of course, these things always happen on the weekends don't they. I will be contacting the auto electrician tomorrow!

In the meantime, I have done some Google research and found out that acid batteries can start boiling for a few different reasons:

- If the battery is overcharged it can cause the electrolyte to heat up and boil.
- An internal short circuit caused by a manufacturing defect, physical damage or age-related degradation.
- A buildup of sulfate crystals on the internal plates.
- Deterioration of the internal components due to age.
- Low electrolyte level.

Although there had been no signs of battery problems before this, the battery was possibly 6 to 7 years old, so I am thinking that age and a deterioration of the internal plates was possibly the cause. I will leave the exact diagnosis to the auto electrician and let you know.

My learning from this is to make sure I check the car or motorhome regularly even when we are not using it. If Sally hadn't noticed the smell when she walked past our motorhome it may well have been a different story!

That's all from me. See you soon and stay safe.

If you don't follow club permit rules, you may be fined.

To keep your club permit, you must:

- be a member of an approved club or association. If you switch clubs, you can't have a gap longer than 14 days between your memberships.
- keep a log book of your trips
- make sure anyone driving the vehicle follows their licence conditions

#### Tell VicRoads if:

- your vehicle's details change (for example, vehicle colour, or garage address)
- your personal details change (address, name)
- you join a new club
- take the vehicle for an audit inspection if VicRoads asks you to
- if your vehicle has operating conditions:
- follow the conditions
- carry the certificate of approved operations in the vehicle.

Using a log book: Follow these rules to use your log book correctly.

- Attach your club permit to the club log book.
- Complete a log book entry every time you drive the vehicle more than 100 metres from the car garage address. If you drive a vehicle multiple times in a day, only record the first use by the first driver.
- If your trip spans before and after midnight, put an entry in your log book for each day.
- Don't write log book entries for future journeys.
- Only use as many entries as your permit allows. Once you use the entries up, you can't drive more than 100 metres from its garage address until you get another permit. For example, a 45-day club permit can only use the first 45 entries. You can get a second 45-day club permit and attach it to the log book.

## 2025 – 2026 Colac Collectable Car Club Inc Annual membership renewals should be paid and finalised by Monday, 30th June, 2025.

Please remember that to use your vehicle on the Club Permit Scheme with VicRoads, vehicle owners must be current financial members of a car club authorised by VicRoads.

If your club membership has lapsed, and not renewed within 30 days from 30th June, 2025 you are in breach of the requirements of the Club Permit Scheme and you are not legally entitled to use your vehicle on the road.

Colac Collectable Car Club Inc will contact VicRoads on 31<sup>st</sup> July, 2025 if your membership has not been paid. All membership renewals were posted to all members (not emailed) in April/May, 2025.

## Adelaide to Darwin 1925 in a 19.6 Crossley

In May, 1925, three chaps set off from Adelaide heading to Darwin and returning to Adelaide via Queensland, Broken Hill, New South Wales to Adelaide. It is understood that the trip was taken to promote Crossley vehicles. The car used was a 1924 Crossley 19.6 model. Team members were George Hearn, Richard C. Ford (39 years old) and Erdley Glenarvon Forrester (33 years old). George Hearn came to Adelaide in 1924 to become the manager of AEC. Although AEC made and imported British lorries and cars, they also sold Crossley Cars.





The team left Adelaide on Thursday, 7<sup>th</sup> May arriving 5 hours later at Orroroo. This is where the Forrester and Ford families were from. From here they travelled north via Oodnadatta, Alice Springs and Katherine, arriving in Darwin on Thursday, 4<sup>th</sup> June. They spent a week in Darwin. Departing Darwin on the 11<sup>th</sup> June, they headed south to Newcastle Waters, then turning east across the Barkley Tablelands towards Queensland, through to Camooweal, Queensland. Heading southeast to Winton, Longreach, Charlieville, Cunnumulla and through the border gate south into New South Wales to Bourke. From Bourke southwest to Broken Hill and from Broken Hill to Burra South Australia. returning to Adelaide South Australia. They arrived back at the AEC premises in the afternoon of Friday, 26<sup>th</sup> June.

"We did make it. But just. The old bus creaked and grouned for the last 25 miles. Bitumen accentuated all noises," These were the comments from E G Forrest's notes on his photograph.

#### **Points to note:**

The Crossley was trimmed of all non-required equipment. Mudguards and windscreen were removed, the back seat removed, and a buckboard tub fitted. A mesh angled grill was fitted to the front to deflect grass seeds. Petrol supplies for the inland journey left Alice Springs by camel, 6 weeks before the team departed. British Imperial Oil Company supplied the petrol and Castrol supplied the oil. They carried 2 spare wheels, extra tyres, a 4-valve receiving wireless, carried 44 gallons of petrol, camping gear, guns for hunting and 12 inch canvas belting on iron supports to fit on the back wheels. An extra fuel tank was fitted. All up, they carried approx. 2 tons of gear. They were caught in many dry bogs. A new differential, front end and tyres were dispatched from Adelaide by railway to just south of Oodnadatta. They followed the railway to Oodnadatta. This is where the train line finished. (The train line reached Alice Springs in 1929 finally connecting to Darwin in February, 2004).

From Oodnadatta, the Crossley team followed the Telegraph line.

There was a train line from Katherine to Darwin. During some of their driving north of Katherine, they adopted a unique way to cross many creeks by driving the car onto the railway lines and used the rail bridges.

## **Adelaide to Darwin 1925 (Continued)**

#### In 1925:

Population of Adelaide 43,000

Population of Alice Springs (then known as Stuart) 30 whites and 300 aboriginals Population of Broken Hill approx 26,000 and population of Darwin approx 2,000 -2,500 Approx 5,500 miles covered on no sealed roads.

Leaving Adelaide in May being autumn, their weather was approx. 18degrees (In 1925 this was the May average). On 7<sup>th</sup> May 2025 it was 24.1 degrees C. Heading north into the dry season temperatures would have been 31 to 36 degrees.

The team chose to travel from May to June to avoid the heat of summer and the wet season in the Northen Territory. They had a dry crossing, bothered only by dust, sand and spinifex until the last part of the journey through southwest Queensland and New South Wales when they encountered rain. Total trip - 50 days. E. G. Forrester passed away in 1967.






