The City of Casey Update

For anyone who's been following the City of Casey permit system drama. This is where the council began enforcing the permit system requiring people to pay permit fees for working on vehicle, storing unregistered vehicle, caravan and sea containers on their property. Here is what I found on the council's website:

"Following a community review in late 2025, the City of Casey clarified and updated rules for vehicles on private land.

- **Minor Repairs:** No permit is required for minor maintenance (e.g., oil changes, belt changes) on your own property.
- **Unregistered Vehicles:** The requirement to have a permit for storing unregistered vehicles on private property was removed in December 2025 to respect residents' rights.
- **Caravans:** You may park a caravan on your property for up to 14 days in any 60-day period without a permit. "



Matters relating to excess unregistered vehicles and vehicle maintenance will be managed through unsightly and noise clauses. So it looks like you can do as you like as long as your property looks tidy from the street and no one complains. There does however still seem to be a lot of rules around property use in the shire, so it would be a good idea to check with council regarding your specific situation.

Elspeth Beard - Around the World on a BMW R60/6

In 1982, Elspeth Beard, just 23 years old, strapped her gear onto a second hand 1974 BMW R60/6 and set off on an adventure that would change her life, and inspire generations to come. With no GPS, no mobile phone, and little support, she began a solo motorcycle journey around the world, covering 35,000 miles across four continents.



Historical Facts

Elspeth Beard was the first Englishwoman to circumnavigate the world on a motorcycle, traveling 35,000 miles on her BMW R60/6. Her journey took 2 years, from 1982-1984.

It was a time when female motorcyclists were almost unheard of, and solo travel by women was considered unthinkable. But Beard wasn't looking for approval, she was chasing something greater. Her journey took her across Europe, into the vast deserts of Australia, through the challenging terrain of Asia, and across the U.S., all while dealing with broken parts, crashes, illness, and relentless solitude. She was robbed, got into accidents, and had to rebuild her motorcycle in strange lands using whatever tools and parts she could find. In places where female independence was often frowned upon, Beard had to rely on her wit, courage, and stubborn resolve to keep going.

When she finally returned to the UK in 1984, she had become the first British woman to ride a motorcycle solo around the world. But there were no parades or newspaper headlines. Her incredible feat was largely ignored, lost in a time that didn't know how to celebrate women like her. For years, her story remained untold.

It wasn't until decades later, when she published her memoir *Lone Rider*, that Elspeth Beard began to receive the recognition she deserved. Her journey not only broke barriers in adventure motorcycling but also challenged gender roles and proved that true adventure belongs to anyone brave enough to chase it. 
