AS SOON AS POSSIBLE

Cover Story - 1924 Ford Model T Tourer - Geof and Jo Baulch

My earliest memories of our T are when my father spoke of it in 1966 when I was 7.

Our "one family T" was purchased new in 1924 by my Great Grandfather from Wade Motors in Hamilton Victoria. The car remained in our family right through until it was given to my father in 1967. Throughout this time, it was driven around the Cavendish, Balmoral and Hamilton districts, and every time it left our property, it had to drive through the creek at the front gate which unfortunately, took its toll on the body work, as you can see in this photo. (That's me, behind the wheel in 1967.

I can remember when Dad was given the car - he and one of his mates setting to work, removing the head amongst other things. I obviously had an interest at a young age as I thought I was being helpful pouring diesel on the bonnet hinges to keep them working. The T stayed on our



family farm for many years, and I remember the chickens roosting in it and pumpkins being stored in it. The hood wasn't on it and all the cushions, and ignition key were missing, but everything else was there.

In the 25 years that Dad owned the car, he dismantled most of it ready for restoration, but due to lack of time and other commitments it remained that way.

I received the car in 1992 as a trailer load of "junk", a giant jigsaw puzzle, and I steadily worked over the next few months carefully piecing it back together. It proved essential as it helped me establish what was missing and what was worn and needed replacing. I then took it all apart again ready to start restoration, something that seemed daunting at the time.

It took me about 10 months to realise that there really were only three main parts to the car - the chassis which I needed to get powder coated, the body that needed repairing and painting, and the engine and electrics that I felt I could tackle myself.

All the running gear, the diffs, springs and anything I decided would be black, went to be sand blasted and powder coated. The body went to a local sheet metal workshop to have the rust cut out and repaired ready for painting.



Then the body went to the spray painters to be painted. This, I decided, should be two pack. We knew the original colour and pin striping of the car from some parts of the body that were constantly covered and so were not rusted or faded.

Jackson's in Sydney were the suppliers of the new valance panels, as there was enough left of the originals to make a copy. The two front mudguards were irreparable and so new ones were purchased from East Coast in Sydney. The engine was then my challenge whilst all of the above was being attended to by others. I realised that the motor hadn't done many miles at all due to the small amount of wear on the bores. I replaced the pistons with aluminium ones when I put the engine back together. I didn't have the main bearings rebabbitted at this stage as they appeared to be okay. (2000 kms later, however, they

disintegrated and were replaced and rebored) I had the cam shaft reground and checked the valves were replaced with new ones, and adjustable lifters were also installed.

The big end caps were drilled and Chev dippers were installed to assist with lubrication. An outside oil line was also put in to help the somewhat inadequate oil feed system that is

standard for 'T' Models.

The transmission was balanced, re-bushed and installed numerous times to get the air gaps on the magnets and pickup bobbins as close as possible, so that the motor, when finished, would run on its original system.

Once all the powder coated parts came home, they were reassembled to form a neat, well finished package. I was happy now as it really started to look like I had done something. The body came home next in its original state, nice and neat, so now I had to be extra careful with the spanners. The new guards and valances could now be fitted and everything lined up. Then to the painters for its makeover.



Next were the wheels and tyres, I could use the original wheels but second-hand felloes were purchased and plated. The tyres were purchased from Antique tyres in Melbourne.

Now that it was all on wheels, it was taken to a mate's place who is an upholsterer. We then worked on it together. The hood we copied from what was left of the old one and I could still use the original bows.

The windscreen was replaced with toughened glass to keep up to safety standards. The headlight reflectors were re silvered and the original glasses were reinstalled. All electrics on the car are 6 volts, as standard, and once started, the magneto is used for the spark.

Now that everything was finished and oil, water and petrol were installed in the correct places, I set about starting it. Like all restorations that haven't been started for many years, the first start usually takes some time, which results in a few blisters. But once started, it can be tweaked and adjusted to run smoothly. A new ignition key was

sourced and purchased from America.

From the start it has taken 3 years, of which about only 2 years was work and 12 months thinking about it. I have now clocked up close to 10,000 miles without any major mechanical problems. The car is a 1924 Model 'T' Ford Tourer and has only 3 doors (no driver's side door) which is original. It is khaki green with a white pinstripe all the way around the top of the body. The guards, valance panels and running boards are black. The hood is cream coloured canvas. All colours are original as taken from the body and remaining hood remnants.

Clubrooms Redevelopment Update #20

This month is a shorter report, as we are in a holding pattern awaiting the Survey Report and OP plan from the Surveyor General. The holdup, as previously reported, is the entitlement to use the land, and issuing the title. You will have seen in the newsletter last month my detailed letter that was sent to the Surveyor General's Office.

We are progressing (although slowly) by adopting a two-pronged approach. While I am keeping in touch with Council (with nothing further to report), Andy has been in touch with the Surveyor General's Office, to follow up my letter, originally lodged via Council. This was 3rd September, with a follow up call received 12th September. He was to be contacted within 1-2 weeks with a timeline, but at the time of writing this, there has been no word.

The bills have at least slowed this month. I asked our contact at Council if they would consider waiving the rent and rates on our site for the year, given the delays. The rent has been waived already, and the rates are being considered by the revenue team, so this is a positive.

On a more positive note, at the last General Meeting, in my role now as Treasurer, I was pleased to be able to report on a substantial donation that has been made to the Building Fund. Frank & Carolyn Whitfield are pleased to have donated \$10,000, and with their consent, it gives me great pleasure to report this and recognise their generosity. At the meeting, Frank spoke of a lot of enjoyment over the last 20 years, they have made many friends, been on many good outings and tours, and enjoy the company and friendship of the Club. As Frank says: "the Members make the Club" and has always been impressed with the co-operation that makes the Club operate, and how well the Club is administered.

There will be a shortfall in overall funding for this project, and as the fit-out progresses, this will become clearer. There has been a Building Fund Donation form developed, so if you are in a position to contribute at some point, this form is available, please contact me for more information.

PAST EVENTS

AOMC Delegates Meeting - 16th August, 2025 at the Maldon Vintage Machinery Museum

VicRoads/CPS report - Members of AOMC and Federation met with VicRoads staff on the 20th May, 2025. Issues discussed included: -

- A proposal to streamline the online CPS permit scheme whereby Club Secretaries pre-authorise/confirm Club membership of the applicant directly on-line to Vic Roads, so that the CPS applicant can then pay permit fees online without having to first have paperwork physically signed.

Electronic logbooks are also under consideration.

A question from the floor enquired about the provision of short term permits to enable collector vehicles to participate in events. The Chairman advised he would take this up with VicRoads.

Apprentice & Business Support Grants: These were launched at the May meeting. If Members are aware of a business that supply vital services to clubs, then that business should be encouraged to apply for a grant. Similarly, if that business has an apprentice, he or she could also be entitled to a grant. Full details on the grants available are on the AOMC website.



Treasurer's Report. The AOMC as at the 31st July has \$281,000 in the bank, and remains in a sound financial position.

The scheme was launched on the 1st of July and 30 Clubs have signed up as of mid-August. The package includes Public Liability and Voluntary Workers Insurance. A basic requirement is the development of Risk Management Plans for a Club's activities. Compliance with this requirement means substantially reduced premiums. AOMC is working on a simplified version of RMPs for smaller low risk clubs.

Club Permit Scheme Handbook: -

A revision of the 2015 Handbook is nearing completion and soon to be sent to VicRoads for their imprimatur.

First and preferred option – Bring your permit renewal to the next club meeting for signing.

If you are unable to attend a meeting then:

Second Option – Mail to Club P.O. Box and include a stamped DL size self-addressed envelope.

Third Option - Mail to Permit Officer address and include a stamped DL size self-addressed envelope.*

Fourth Option – Drop into Permit Officer's letterbox for pick up the following business day (include your phone number to get a text to say it's ready for pick up) or include a stamped DL size self-addressed envelope.*

Fifth Option – Contact Permit Officer and make other arrangements.

<u>VERY IMPORTANT</u> – When applying for a new Permit - PLEASE make sure you have ALL the necessary documents. This will save both you and the Permit Officer a lot of wasted time.

Sports Car Run - Sunday 28th September

A small group of about 10 sports cars were greeted by a sunny but chilly morning at our departure place. The travel lists were handed out while Charlotte handed out the goodies. After some discussion by the group and a list of instructions about road closures, we headed off at about 9.40am.

We headed out along Gillies Street but soon struck the first road works. We followed the detour instructions before finally returning to Gillies Street to continue our journey. It was then off towards Clunes but there were a couple more roadworks to slow down and navigate along the way.




