



# Life in Bali—what I observed over there recently!

Jo, myself and our two daughters just did a couple of weeks in Bali. From a vehicle owners perspective it was an interesting place to visit, especially as I hadn't been there since 1997!





Above Left: I was curious to see if my phone's speedo app would work in the plane, it did! We flew for four hours and had only just made it to Broome WA! The flight was only another hour and a bit after this. We flew Jetstar, a nice new Airbus A321



Above: Most people ride scooters, around the 125—150cc size. Helmets are supposed to be worn (about 40% do). Lady passengers with skirts ride side saddle. Three or Four onboard is OK, mum, dad and the kids!

Left: Obeying signs is optional. No parking along this bit of street! This was one of the bigger streets, lots of room on the roadway.



Left: A typical smaller street. Just enough room for a car to get past the parked bikes but required some cooperation if a car was coming the other war. Bikes are allowed to overtake on either side of cars. At intersections, if you can get your nose in first, you go. Being a bigger vehicle helps. All the time we were there, I didn't see any anger, crashes or even scratches on vehicles. The beige tiles are the sidewalk, quite slippery when wet which was quite often while we were there. especially in the second week. You would see a storm coming off the ocean, it would blow and rain sideways for half an hour then clear up. Other times it just bucketed straight down without any wind. The locals don't even measure it. I estimate most downpours would have been half to one inch of rain per half hour.



Left: Both our resorts had staff at the gate. This one even included a mirror check under the car as well. Above: This is a pretty simple power pole set up, a mixture of electricity and Internet. Other poles had more hanging off then than this. I don't know how they know what is what!





Left: Saw a couple of little 4WD's with modified front suspension. It's hard to see in this pic but the front end is jacked up about 40cm above standard for some reason. (To look cool???)

Below: Dog etiquette, your dog has to have a nappy or be in a stroller if indoors. Icon Bali is a new shopping arcade in Sanur where you can buy stuff for the same price as you can here! Petrol is about \$1 per litre for low octane (about 85) and you can buy it for your scooter in Absolut Vodka bottles on the side of the street. There is 92 octane which is blue and costs a bit more. The unscrupulous can dye the rubbish fuel blue and make a profit selling it as 92! Petrol stations as we know them are far less common than we are used to as most people just buy a bottle full when they need it. This pic also shows you how wide the sidewalks are. You aren't very far from the passing traffic.

*After that everyone headed for Phil and Sue Roeszler's home where we enjoyed a BBQ lunch ending with apple pie and ice cream or cream or both.* 



Body and Engine numbers, stampings and plates or VIN number

Present this information to the permit scheme officers, they will do the appropriate paperwork for Vicroads.

Also remember to keep your old logbooks for 12 months.
