#### Cover Story – 1908 International Motor Buggy – Andy Burns

In the early 1970s, I saw my first motor buggy at the Gippsland Motor Museum – I was fascinated by it. My passion is early veteran vehicles although my first car was a 1930 improved A Model Ford.

It took 23 years to find my buggy and it came from Mississippi in America. It was shipped out in a very sad state; over 8 years, I hand built it making many of the parts. To restore such a unique vehicle is incredibly satisfying but can be very frustrating as well – it often breaks down and brings all sorts of emotions – it's very cantankerous – joy - frustration – happiness – pain – serenity – are a few that come to mind.

It has two gears and reverse, no roof or windscreen and travels at 22kph. The engine is 2-cylinder horizontally opposed, and it has a total loss oil system, so it just dumps it on the ground once the engine has used it. If you love being cold, wet, hot or windblown, this is the vehicle for you.

#### Clubrooms Redevelopment Update #15

I reported last month that April would be a slower month, due to the reduced number of 'working' days - however this has not been the case!

Actions speak louder than words, and they say a picture is worth a thousand words. So, if you are able to, have a drive past the clubrooms site - pull up where safe to do so - and have a look (from the outside of the fence please!).

On approach, you will notice the temporary fencing around the perimeter (that has been up for a while now), and recently the back section came down, however a vigilant neighbour and prompt action from our Property Officer had it remedied in no time at all.

Then you might notice the site hut - there was a request for assistance

to establish the work site - but to no avail, so we have needed to rent one for 3 months.

And then if you haven't spotted it already - the clubrooms are gone (A).

As planned, the windows were removed on the Wednesday before Easter, and the demolition took place on the Tuesday and Wednesday after Easter, with all materials being separated and recycled as appropriate, including the metal and bricks/concrete. The stumps from the three trees on the verandah side were also removed.

Too late now

As I write this, the site is being cleaned up and levelled, with fresh fill added as needed to fill in the holes. A big thanks to all involved in the operation, including those who helped and supervised - 'gate openers' and our photographers and recorder.

Next will be the retaining wall that is required on the south side - and pleasingly no permit is required for this one as it is lower than the threshold height. The pine posts along the drain have been removed and works have commenced on the retaining wall.

Did you know the bluestone drain does not run parallel to the fence line next door?

The manufacture of the new structure is now also complete, and ready to be shipped when we are ready to receive.

The final progress payment (balance before delivery) in line with the schedule of works has been received. This will just leave the cost of the erection to be paid.

Separately, we are currently pricing the windows and doors, and working through the options available to us.

It is pleasing to see the number of members who are assisting in various ways with all parts of this project, from minor to major things, and all going about it in a quiet and unassuming manner. I have been deliberate in not specifically naming individual members - but you know who you are (and we know who you are too).



One last bite - and it's all over, red rover!

So this month's call for assistance is to extend on this. As we look ahead to the fit-out stage, do you have a trade and would like to be involved? e.g. we have the offer of a painter, and data infrastructure, and there will be many more needed. If you are able to help out, please let a member of the subcommittee know.

And lastly for this month, in relation to the road discontinuance and lease, I have checked in with Council. They advised the invoice has been paid for the surveying of the closed road. Further, they confirmed that DEECA has no issues with Council including the closed road area in the lease plan prior to it being formally gazetted. So, they are progressing with the lease.

The only other comment they had was that the adjacent Scout Hall has made a complaint to Council around the

temporary fence protruding their access to the rear of their building! This has been attended to, as well as cleaning up their clutter that was slowing their access.

Finally - the Building Subcommittee is also about to meet (Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> April) to look at progress to date, and costs to date versus budget etc.

After lunch, Kevin led us up through the gardens, and explained the façade and amazing topiary work he has done to frame the main entrance. From there it was in and around all the rooms of the house with more stories and before and after photos of each room. Some rooms are still a work in progress but his attention to detail and self-taught artisan skills are a tribute to his vision for over 30 years of rebuilding and restoring without losing the original character of the home.



His highlight is restored the and only recently crane lifted top of the main tower over the front entrance. Our was group allowed to wander freely around and climb the tower to take in the vista from the elevated 360degree view. The tiaht winding stairs were a bit of a challenge but there was no

stopping Maree Sherlock who ascended on hands and knees, gave a "woohoo" at the top and came down the same way. (ps Maree will be 90 in a few months' time – so a great effort!)

The rear courtyard and modernized kitchen area blend in with the elderly structure, and there is a B&B style unit extending into the former stables area with views over the rear courtyard.

Over Easter and the Melbourne Cup long weekends, the house is open for visits and morning and afternoon tea. Kevin will again be hosting the tours, and he could literally talk passionately for hours about the stories and characters who have been through these elaborate hallways.

Soon enough, it was around mid-afternoon, and people began to make their way home, some like us stopping at Skipton or Linton for a drink or an ice cream. The farmers in the area were all raising dust as they were dry seeding with the hope of some rain in the next week or two. We love the fine weather, but no one will begrudge a decent bit of precipitation before the cold of winter does set in.



McCormick Harvester Company and the Deering Company in 1902 led to still producing the Titan and



Mogul Tractors. Most of their early tractors, however, were designed for ploughing and belt work, leaving jobs like cultivation,

planting and mowing to a team of horses. By 1917, the engineers of both companies were working together to produce smaller tractors to compete with the new Fordson Tractor. As a result, the company introduced the International 15-30 model in 1921, which was as up-to-date as any tractor on the market at that time.

As successful as farm tractors had become by the 1920's, there was still a desperate need on a farm for a tractor that could do it all. Every tractor to date was either heavy and powerful for belt work and for pulling large implements, or it was light and manoeuvrable for cultivating raw crops.

Recognising the demand for a machine that could fill both roles, International Harvester began working on a suitable machine. By 1923, they developed this type of machine and called it the "Farmall". As the name implied, it could do all that a farmer wanted it to do.


In short order, the Farmall tractor changed not only the future of the International Harvester Company, but the future of the entire tractor industry worldwide!



By way of interest, I found out a couple of years ago that Nerene Backhouse and Warrick Pitcher's father had an International A414 tractor, so I have asked them to write something of that tractor.

From Nerene - Dad purchased the A414 in 1964 from Howard Lockett & Sons in Ballarat – the salesman was Ken Belsar. Dad had won the State Tractor Driving Championship in 1963 which was held at Dean, and was part of the Begonia Festival - Howard Lockett's provided the seven tractors for the competition and the International Harvester Company provided £200 prize money. After driving the A414, Dad decided a new tractor was needed.

From Warrick – When the tractor was delivered, I was a sticky-beak 8-year-old, and just had to get up on the trailer and sit in the seat – this was while Dad and the driver were talking. In due course, the driver told me that I'd better get down so he could back the tractor off the trailer. Dad said, "the young bloke'll do it". I duly backed the tractor off the trailer to the amazement of the driver.

That tractor did a power of all sorts of work in the time Dad had it. When the laws came in about putting a ROPS on tractors, Dad and I devised a plan to incorporate a cabin as well. That cabin ended up saving my life the first time we used it after finishing it. In the 1982 drought, Dad and I were cleaning out some dams while they were dry.

I was on the Inter when all of a sudden, the tractor slid side-ways and ended up on its side. If the cabin had not been on the tractor, I would probably have been crushed. We righted the tractor with the Fergy – it was good as gold and so was I, so we continued our work. The 'Inter' was finally sold at a community clearing sale in Elaine in 1984.




