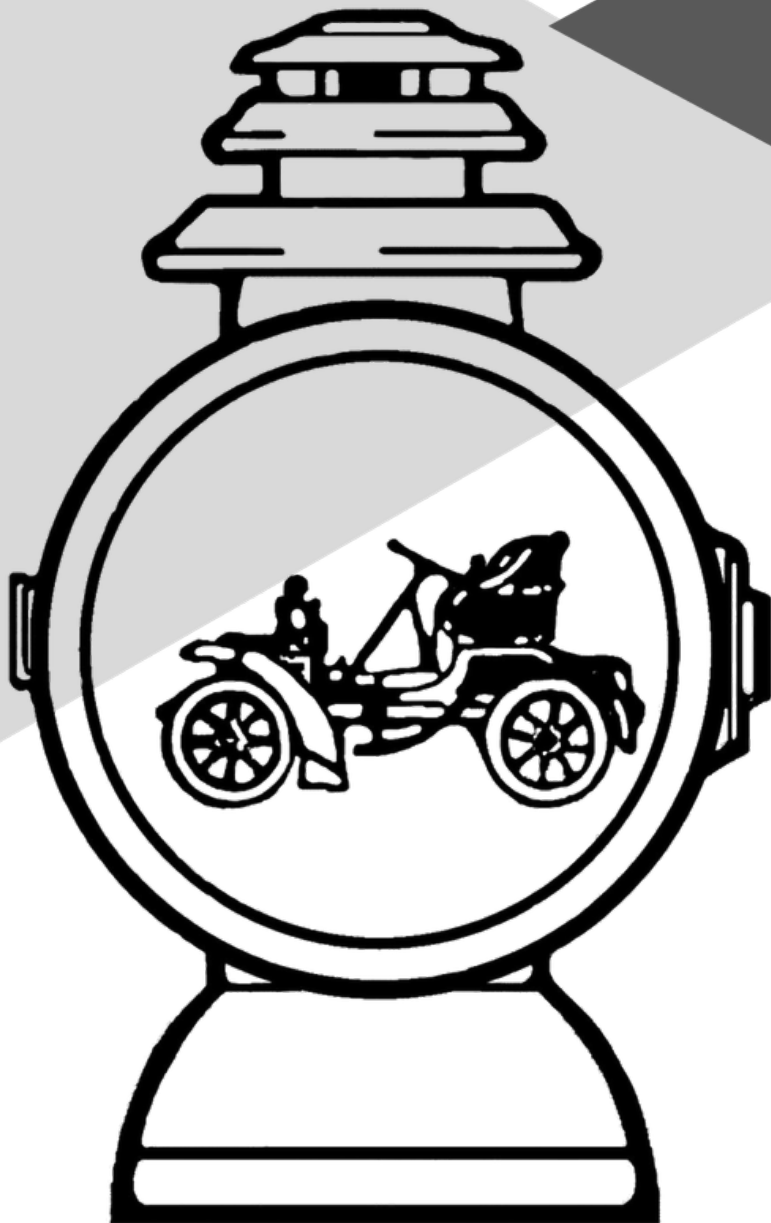

On Wednesday 15th July 17 people enjoyed a very interesting and informative tour of the Kurrajong Recycling Centre in Chaston Street Wagga.

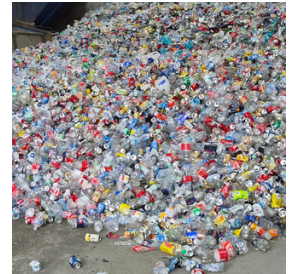
We met Kelly, our tour host, who helped us through the electronic registration process, provided everyone with a HI-VIS vest and seated us in the training room where we were shown many items that we can, or should not, place in our yellow lid recycling bin. It was very enlightening and Kelly was very accommodating in answering our many questions.

The group was then able to view the loading bay, through the large inspection window where the trucks unload the recycling collected from our yellow lid bins. The unloaded pile is then pushed onto a conveyer belt that passes by various groups of workers who manually sort what can be recycled.

Items that are rejected are eventually loaded into a very, very large skip bin that is taken to the tip daily at Kurrajong's expense.

Seeing the process certainly made us more aware that we should be more diligent in what we place in our recycling bins.

We were then taken to the paper shed, plastic shed and electronic shed where workers were again sorting and dismantling items.



It was a very worthwhile tour and I think everyone that attended learnt something new about recycling. Most of the group then drove to the Rules Club where a delicious lunch was enjoyed by all

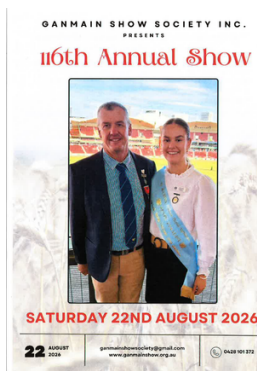
