David Powell was previously a member in the 1980s and 1990s. He hails from Howrah in Tasmania and owns a 1929 Sports and 1930 Van project.


Another new member from across the ditch is Champbell Sutton from Wellington, New Zealand who has a late 1928 Chummy with coil ignition.

LONG PAST EVENTS

'From a Book by Bill Body, May 1947'

The Junior Car Club 1924 200 mile race at Brooklands. Of 50 race starters,

nine were Austin 7s.

The fastest Austin 7 and best finisher was Gordon England with an average speed of 75.6mph. Captain Waite was third of only four Austins to finish. The race was won by Lee Guinness in a 1½lt Talbot Darracq at an average



speed of 102.2mph. Talbot Darracqs were 2nd and 3rd.

The other photo included is Arthur Dodson driving a Twin Cam Austin at Donnington Park in 1936.

He drove this same car on Brooklands outer circuit, in October 1936, setting a new class record at 121.14 mph, and took nine records, including 100 miles at average of 115.05 mph.

My well-known "Black Bess" is For Sale.

I am reluctant to part with such a well loved car, but I am finding, with my advancing age and reduced mobility, I am not using it, and therefore offer it For Sale, hopefully to an A7 club member, or similar enthusiast, who will use and treasure it as I have.

The body was built by Bill Sheehan, its style based on the A7 which won the first Australian Grand Prix. It is a 2-seater with cycle guards.

The car has recently been given a thorough mechanical overhaul by noted Austin 7 expert, Walter Raschle, which included attention to the engine, transmission, suspension etc. The brakes were attended to, now being hydraulic on all four wheels, with a dual master cylinder.

The car is a 1929 model, with several later parts. Mechanically, it is fitted with a later engine, fitted with a Fraser crankshaft, Renault pistons and rods and all the appropriate performance modifications eg. SU carburetor, better inlet and exhaust systems, modified valves, springs and camshaft & pressure oil supply. It is now 803cc capacity with a 4 speed gear box.

The car has always been a strong performer, particularly on hills. With the works carried out by Walter Raschle it is even better in this regard.

It is on club plates, which are not transferable, and it is offered for sale at \$20,000.

The future of HISTORIC WINTON is in danger from a lack of support by Club Members.

The President has alerted everyone that a few key positions need new volunteers, as a few key club members have retired.

It appears to be inappropriate to surrender control of these functions to non Club Members.

The most important of those are:-

- ⇒ Paddock Office Coordinator (mouse house) Manages the supplies that are needed are taken to the circuit, a suitable roster is prepared for Friday, Saturday and Sunday, arranges set-up early on Friday, and packing up on Sunday. Arranges suitable training for Officials Sign-On and other services, and Coordinates with Drivers Sign-On. (John McMillan is retiring)
- ⇒ Drivers Sign-On Coordinator, at the Paddock Office Needs suitable computer skills to operate the registration process on the Club Computer software, already pre-loaded by the Secretary and Entry Secretary. (Greg Drummond stepped in this year, after the death of Gary Hawkins)
- ⇒ Event Sponsorship and Advertising in programme. Entails contacting almost 40 existing Sponsors/Advertisers, and other potential participants, and arranging copy for the programme, and all the related coordination, for billing done by others. (Greg Drummond has been doing this task for some years)

In each case, a good system of Procedures is available, and assistance by the retiring Coordinators.

INITIAL APPLICATION FOR A CLUB PERMIT

Given the responsibility for compliance with eligibility, the Club does not authorise CPS applications for MODIFIED vehicles, other than Austin 7s and their derivatives, since the Club Permit Officers would not have sufficient experience to judge eligibility, and are now required to attest to eligibility.

*An applicant for a *Club Permit for any vehicle other than an Austin 7 must be a Full Member of the Austin Seven Club Inc.*

The Club Permit Officer will request a statement from any applicant for new CPS vehicles that are NOT Austin 7s, to state that the vehicle is not modified outside the Regulations, or the VSI 8 or the VSI 33, whichever are applicable, and that any vehicle manufactured after 30 June 1975 meets the ADRs.

TO APPLY FOR A NEW PERMIT

Your Club Permit Officers will require the following with your CPS application:-

- ♦ MUST be on the VicRoads Club Permit Application Form
- MUST be accompanied by a VicRoads Vehicle Eligibility and Standards Declaration for Club Permit Vehicles Form
- MUST be accompanied by a current Certificate of Roadworthiness (within 30 days of the Declaration Date) The alternate VicRoads "Guideline Vehicle Safety Inspection Checklist" is NOT accepted, as the Club does not have any authorised CPS Scrutineers.
- Dated photographs of front, driver's side, back, driving positions (side on with driver's door open), and where possible - Chassis number, engine number, car number and a photo of ALL modifications.
- An application for a "modified" Austin 7 MUST be accompanied by a VASS approval certificate
- An application for a "modified" Austin 7 motorcycle MUST be shown to meet the Standards applying to Motorcycle & Mopeds VSI 4
