

Cover Story

From Gears to Grace: My Journey to the Jaguar

Ever since I was a kid, machines fascinated me. I've always been a kinaesthetic - tinkering, tweaking, and exploring mechanical possibilities was second nature. I completed my bachelor's in mechanical engineering in India, pursued my higher education in Australia but in Information Technology. Unfortunately, the post-9/11 job market made IT opportunities scarce, and I found myself working in finance as a Foreign Exchange Consultant.

But the love for machines never left me. As soon as I started earning, I began buying motorcycles. Actually, I bought my first motorcycle Suzuki Across 250cc, 2001 Sept 12 or Sept 11. Maybe bad omen - I lost my licence for 1 year within three months. But passion never faded. These days, I cruise on a 1996 Kawasaki Vulcan 1500 Classic, commute with a 2004 Kawasaki Z1000, and run errands on a 2000 Yamaha YP250. Each bike has its own story, its own rhythm. Currently, own 8.5 motorcycles.

The cover photo for this piece features my pride and joy: a 1988 Jaguar XJ40 Sovereign 3.6L—with air conditioning, of course.

Why a Jaguar?

Some might ask, "Why not a HSV or a 300ZX?" Well, I did own a 1989 Nissan 300ZX non-turbo for seven years. Loved it, but had to let it go due to maintenance costs and life's curveballs. Still keeping an eye out for another 300ZX or Skyline, though—on a tight budget.

Anyway, back in June 2003, Jaguar released a TV ad titled *Born to Perform*. It ended with a quote from founder

Sir William Lyons:

"The car is the closest thing we will ever create to something that is alive."

That line hit my heart and has stayed with me always. When I see VCCC members and I think, car or machines is the closest thing that has brought all of us together.

Also, Dec 2003 is also the year, my wife joined me. Definitely not a thing - a living

being. 100%. As an artist, she always loved that Jaguar leaping over the bonnet.

The Road to VCCC

Fast forward to 2023, and I finally became a VCCC member. I didn't own a vintage car at the time—just a 1995 Royal Enfield 350 Classic. But I was determined to find a Jaguar within my \$5K budget.

Richard English kindly shared a lead on a 1983 red Jag listed at \$6,500—just out of reach. Then in November 2023, I spotted an '88 Jag on Car Sales for \$8K. I bookmarked it and kept searching. In March 2024, the price dropped to \$4,900—finally within budget!

I messaged the owner on Friday and locked in a viewing for Sunday morning. Saturday was a nerve-wracking wait. Saturday evening, I got an email from the seller: "Raj, this is a 35-year-old car—not a daily driver. I don't want you to be disappointed. If you're after reliability, a Toyota might be better."

That fired up my curry blood! I replied with my current lineup of 7.5 9 (then) motorcycles and cars. He responded politely, "You know what you're doing."

Sunday, 9:45 AM—I saw the Jag and paid the deposit. The owner warned me: "If you don't pick it up in two weeks, you'll forfeit your deposit." I said, "Mate! I'm coming tomorrow evening with a UVP. Keep it ready."

I thank Derek for the connection and always send good wishes to the previous owner whenever I see my Jag. It's not just a car—it's a chapter in my story.

I drive a Jaaaag ! To be continued

Letter to the Editor

Hi Nerene,

I thought I'd write to you about a matter which might be relevant to many members of the group, which I thought might warrant a mention in the club newsletter. It is about a recent experience with RACV Total Care Roadside Assistance.

While we were away in UK, we received a SMS text from RACV, advising some changes to our road side assistance, and that our subscription was overdue for payment. Payment of the account was easily processed, but I couldn't get to ring them from the UK.

Up until now, RACV Total Care Roadside Assistance was about covering the driver/s which meant that we had cover in whatever vehicle we were driving, which suited us due to having various cars and bikes, classics and modern.

Now, after the changes were introduced, the cover is applied to nominated vehicles - up to 2 vehicles can be nominated, and extra vehicles can be added at extra cost. This arrangement was not favourable to us.

At least I thought that - until we returned home and I rang the RACV to query the change.

Eventually, after getting through the automated phone system, I got to talk to a person, to voice my 'disappointment.' It was then that I was told that club permit vehicles can be nominated for no additional cost, so after giving full details of all our club permit vehicles, it now appears that our Roadside Assistance cover is almost the same as before.

If you think that you might be adversely affected by the changes introduced to your RACV Total Care Roadside Assistance cover, I would urge you to make contact with the RACV to discuss the matter, and to get your club permit vehicles covered.


From reports at the end, the organisers were extremely happy with the day, and commented that next year's event would be bigger and better – something to look forward to.



Report - AOMC meeting held 17th November, 2025 at the Jaguar Austin Healey Clubrooms, Springvale

This evening comprised two meetings, the ordinary quarterly meeting and the Annual General meeting.

Presentation -

The quarterly meeting led off with a guest speaker from "Kids under Cover". The primary thrust of this presentation was an invitation for members of the public to donate unwanted cars in saleable order to the charity. The focus of the charity is to put tiny house/accommodation in a backyard to enable a young person at risk to stay in contact with his/her family but be somewhat independent. They have over a thousand of these accommodation units in place throughout the eastern seaboard. The car is collected by Manheim Auctions and auctioned off with the proceeds going to the charity.

Club Permit Scheme Handbook -

Delegates were advised of progress on re-developing the Club Permit Scheme booklet which is currently with VicRoads/Department of Transport for final review.

Club Insurance -

Some 72 Clubs had signed up to the AOMC initiated insurance scheme as of the meeting date, and some 27 Clubs had submitted their Risk Management Plans (RMP). The AOMC has provided simpler requirements to complete a RMP for smaller clubs with low-risk activities.

Club Permit Scheme -

There are still instances of Police stopping CPS plated vehicles and advising that the vehicle is not permitted when in fact the necessary fees had been paid. The issue arises when the payment is not fully processed at VicRoads. The advice is to a) staple the receipt in the back of your log-book, and b) check your VicRoads account and in particular your CPS plated cars for currency.

Cultural Heritage Act -

Daryl Meek spoke at some length about the Cultural Heritage Act which is administered by the Department of the Arts. Its purpose is to protect Australian heritage artifacts, and can be applied to all manner of things including tractors, paintings, and cars amongst many things. The message was if you became aware something that was likely to leave the country which you thought was significant, do something about it, and contact the AOMC in the first instance to get the matter addressed.

RACV Total Care -

There is some confusion about the changes to RACV total care insurance. You can have up to 15 vehicles listed. For quality advice ring the Total Care Package number, rather than the Road Side Assist personnel.

Annual General Meeting -

The Chairman made brief reference to the Club Insurance Scheme and in particular the effort by some members of the Executive that went in to it over some years to get it up and running

The Treasurer's report was also tabled and the summary is, Income of \$170,000, Expenditure of \$176,000 and a Net Loss for the year of \$6,000. The AOMC has Assets of \$310,000, Liabilities of \$59,000, and therefore Net Assets and Members Funds of \$251,000.

Daryl Meek took the chair and the usual preliminaries including thanking the outgoing committee and administrative officer Howard Billings were completed. The current executive was returned, Keith Mortimer President, Iain Ross Vice-President, Mark Fenton Treasurer, and Tony Hall Secretary. Whilst the committee has provision for 10 members, six were elected.


Vintage Car Club of New Zealand Magazine
Donated by Mike Simpson

At the June meeting of our club, Mike donated this current magazine which he very generously does every couple of months for our club library. This magazine is always very popular with our members. Each magazine has a large photo of a club vehicle on the front cover with a major article and road test for the particular vehicle inside the magazine.

On the front cover of this magazine is a large photo of a green veteran tourer labelled as "The Highway King" – a V12 engined Austin! I know from all our English Austin Books and the book on the American Austin Bantam cars in our club library, neither company produced a V12 engined model. This had to be a unique car! At home later that night, I looked through my well used Georgano Motor Car Encyclopaedia that Marg gave me in 1969 for my birthday to find that there was another American Austin Company with a photograph of a 1914 Austin 66 48HP Tourer.

It seems that in 1901, one James E Austin and his son Walter S Austin formed the Austin Automobile Company in Grand Rapids, Michigan in America to build the best possible car that could be built. By 1903, they had produced a four-cylinder roadster of the best quality for its time. Another Austin Motor Company was found in England by Herbert Austin in 1905 but no one seemed concerned there were two companies producing Austin cars.

The American company added another partner named Weidley who was an impressive engineer in his own right who improved the American Austin Cars. In 1913 Walter developed the two-speed rear axle and by 1917 Weidley had produced a flat headed V12 engine with four banks of three cylinders with hemispherical head overhead style of 450 cubic inches capacity. The large tourer was displayed for sale at the 1917 Detroit Auto Show. They called the Austin "The Highway King", this large tourer which they built until 1921 when production stopped.





The Company produced about 1000 cars between 1903 and 1921. This Austin V12 Tourer was imported in recent years when a New Zealand club member was working in America and Canada. It is the only New Zealand Austin from America at this time and the test drive was unreal.

The car has three-foot pedals, a gear lever and a handbrake. But it's not what it seems! The left pedal – the first half of the travel is the clutch, but the second part disengages the transmission, so that both brakes can be engaged! The middle pedal is the parking brake which disengages when the button is pushed down. The right-hand pedal is the accelerator. The handbrake lever is used for engaging the tow speed differential. As to be expected the power of the V12 engine was very impressive on the road.

In this magazine there are also articles on a 1948 K series Bedford truck, a 1929 Ford AA tip truck as well as four colour pages of cars, motorcycle, trucks and tractors for sale. The exchange rate is always favourable for us Australian readers. The details of spare parts for sale for Daimler, Jaguar and Lanchester cars are also in the excellent magazine. Thanks again Mike! I wonder how many American Austin cars are in Australia?

Fifth Option – Contact Permit Officer and make other arrangements.
