

For many roles, that help the success of the event, you do not even need to attend the event, there are many tasks that simply need attendance to administration and promotion, in advance, and others that require help afterwards.



Recently some club members have expressed a desire to learn about the AED (automatic External Defibrillator) that we have at the club. The best way to learn about these devices is through a CPR course. We are currently looking for





expressions of interest in a combination First-Aid and CPR course to be held at the club rooms.

There are two options available:

Online theory component (2 hours @ \$110)

Full face-to-face (6 hours @ \$150)

Both courses will provide you with a recognised qualification (HLTAID009 and HLTAID011) that can be used in the workplace, with other volunteer organisations or even just to keep your family safe.

Built by John Bowring in 1957 from a1937 Austin 7 Ruby to compete in the then Austin 7 racing class.

Competed extensively at Phillip Island, Templestowe Hill Climb, etc, where it held many lap records.

Raced at the 1958 Melbourne Grand Prix at Albert Park.

Purchased in 1988 by an expatriate Australian living in Hong Kong and competed in Pasir Gudang, Johore, Malaysia in 1959, Macau Grand Prix in

1990/1992/1993, Hong Kong, Singapore, etc.



Purchased and bought back to Australia by John Bowring's son Craig in 2012 and it ran in the AGP Historic Demonstration in 2013.

He was awarded the annual aggregate trophy for competition in December, at A7 Club, as well as winning the 2024 VSCC annual trophy for the best performance of a young driver.

We purchased this car a couple of years ago from Craig Bowring, (John's son), after it spent some 15 years in Hong Kong, where it competed at the Macau Grand Prix three times, Johore, Malaysia, Singapore, etc.

It needed some re-commissioning and sorting out after spending about 10



years at the Warrnambool Motor Museum, as cars should be driven and used, not stuck stationary in a museum, so we believe.

OUR AUSTINS - Bowring A7 Special

Editor's Note: Barry promised a report on Sean's participation in the AGP

Parade - here it is!

We purchased the car from Craig Bowring a couple of years ago for the use by our then 14 Y.O. grandson Sean so he could learn to drive properly which we feel is important whilst also bringing in some much needed younger blood into the historic scene.

The car needed considerable recommissioning and sorting out after



sitting around for a number of years as cars need to be driven which we all know and understand.

Sean started off by driving down our farm tracks where we fitted 19" wheels to give some additional ground clearance and then progressed to Rob Roy, Eddington Sprints, Geelong Revival and a couple of track days at Calder and Broadford.

We have to ration out the time spent in the Austin 7 as Sean also has his schooling to consider which is a priority.

When he was younger Sean did several runs at the AGP as a passenger in the historic demonstration events in various cars including a Bentley Speed Six, Lotus Elan and an Austin Healey.

His goal with the Austin 7 was to one day run that in the AGP historic demonstration, which happened sooner than we all thought, as he was invited to run the car at the 2025 AGP event, "The Fabulous Fifties".

This involved three sessions of about 20 minutes each.

However, he learnt from that mistake and both he and the car performed well in in the second and third sessions.

The organisers must be congratulated in making a special effort to encourage young drivers to participate in historic motorsport, as if we do not do that then historic cars have a very uncertain future.

For this we should all do our bit, as much as possible.

Development Victoria has issued a notice to vacate the restoration site by the end of June. This places the entire project in jeopardy.

Robert, Fiona and I were among the first to arrive and were met by Mark, John McMillan's son-in-law who was a little bit nervous, wondering whether we would be interested in the catering equipment he was about to show us, but we were happy to let him know that we were looking forward to seeing the



equipment we never see at restaurants and other food outlets as it is mostly out of sight.

After a delicious morning tea, freshly baked that morning, we began our tour. I found the size of the cooktops and ovens alone was amazing and even imagining the size of the pots and pans used to cook such great quantities of food and the strength involved was remarkable.

All the equipment comes from overseas, mostly Italy or the US and Canada with the only equipment


Australia can acknowledge is in the cheaper range where all the outer casings are made overseas and the inner workings are assembled here.

When a commercial kitchen is constructed using high end products it can easily cost \$50,000+ which is an



enormous outlay for a small business to handle.

Interestingly commercial kitchens need to operate using gas as this is more cost efficient, which begs the question of Victorians being asked to convert to electricity only in their homes.



All the food is monitored and kept under strict temperature control so that it can be held for use longer, which is another thing I wasn't sure about, especially when you think about take-away, such as at MacDonalds. Probably better not worry about it.

The latest piece of equipment which was shown to us was from Germany and is a steam /convection oven which has 20-30 shelves in it and can be programmed using an app to cook different foods on different shelves and we were treated to steak on one shelf and chips on the other.

Unfortunately with this type of machine chefs are becoming obsolete in many areas and are basically taught how to operate these machines using pre-packaged food which is a great shame.

After such an interesting visit we then set off for the Graham Hotel in Port Melbourne for lunch which was a delightful location and we didn't ask how the food was prepared.

It was all sealed off with a delicious steak "barbequed" in the steam oven. It was voted a total success along with the chips, despite their lack of

stratospheric cholesterol possibilities

After this we retired to the delightful Graham Hotel in Port Melbourne for lunch (which they had being doing since 1870). I was tempted to ask about their kitchen and equipment, but exercised enormous restraint and just enjoyed the meal that was presented.
