

How much carbon does your vehicle emit?

There is a lot of discussion about global warming, greenhouse gases and the need to reduce carbon dioxide. There will be increasing pressure to reduce fossil fuel (hydrocarbon) usage as this is a major producer of carbon dioxide (CO₂).

If we are to preserve Australia's cultural heritage in operating condition and continue the social and economic benefits that flow from this, we will need to eliminate or offset our carbon emissions.

Operating Heritage Australia supports a three-step approach to minimising carbon emissions from historic machinery:

- 1. minimise the use of fossil fuels in all aspects of daily life
- 2. use renewable fuels where appropriate.
- where no alternative is available, offset emissions by supporting projects that consume more carbon dioxide than we produce.

We need your support to inform decision-makers and the general public that our contribution to climate change is tiny and that we are working to eliminate, through renewable fuels or offsets even that tiny amount.

First, start by understanding the size of the problem – how much carbon dioxide does your historic vehicle actually emit each year?

Find where your vehicle's fuel consumption intersects with its km/year to find CO₂ in kg.

For example, on average, Australian historic cars (based on the latest FIVA survey) travel around 1200 km/yr and if we assume a 14L/100km (20mpg) fuel consumption, then the amount of carbon dioxide produced is 504kg for the year.

As a comparison:

- A human breathes out around 240kg CO2 per year
- A medium-sized dog produces (breathing and food) 700-800kg CO₂ per year
- A typical electric car driving 10,000 km per year and charged from the grid produces around 1150kg

In 2023 the majority of historic motor vehicles could have their total carbon emissions offset through ethical revegetation schemes for under \$20 per year.

Some other information:

The total amount of petroleum fuels used each year by the 500,000 owners of historic vehicles accounts for around 0.05% of Australia's total petroleum-based fuel consumption. There is no viable alternative available at this time.

The average electric vehicle will produce less carbon <u>per kilometre</u> than an internal combustion vehicle – around half that of a modern vehicle and around a quarter that of an historic vehicle (and less if charged by solar or wind).

<u>Any</u> new vehicle (electric or internal combustion) will produce carbon dioxide during its construction (materials, assembly and transport). According to the International Energy Agency, manufacturing a mid-sized internal combustion vehicle will produce around 6t CO₂ and a similar electric vehicle around 8-10t depending on the type and size of battery. This means that it if you <u>replace</u> your historic vehicle with <u>any</u> new vehicle, it could take around 20 years before you have saved the carbon used to manufacture the new vehicle.

OHA will try to keep you up-to-date in this rapidly changing area of alternative energy sources for motor vehicles. If you have any questions, please contact your local association/AHMF/whatever.

This comes from the AOMC:

CO2 emissions – Federation have sent an information sheet. Graeme said AOMC, through Greenfleet, are promoting a new initiative to support a carbon offset scheme where you nominate how many kms you will travel each year in your historic vehicle then pay a small annual fee to offset the carbon generated. \$18 for 3000km per year and \$36 for 6000km per year. Greenfleet invests funds by planting and maintaining biodiverse forests.

Call me cynical but this sounds like "We will add 4c per litre tax to fix the roads" from years gone by.

The screen shot below comes from Ken Andrews showing the position of the VACC. Hopefully its readable.

Greenhouse gas offsets and how the movement is proceeding with this.

A letter has been sent to Vic Roads with concerns raised at these meetings.

Guest Speaker Geoff Gwilyn CEO of VACC:

Geoff Gwilyn CEO of Victorian Automobile Chamber of Commerce gave a talk on the future of the Vintage, Veteran and Classic Car movement and the introduction of Electric Vehicles. Geoff explained that the VACC has been pushing the Victorian Government to introduce annual roadworthy checks on all vehicles over 8 years old.

Presently the Government is refusing to do this as no statistics are available to support their request, if this was to become compulsory vehicles on CPS may not be exempt. The Federal Government hope to have 90% of cars electric by 2030, Victoria State Government are hoping to meet the target of 50% of cars being electric by 2030, countries around the world are offering incentives to get more electric vehicles on their roads, 80% of new cars in Norway are now electric, Norway having the water supply to support the production of electricity usage, as does Tasmania and New Zealand in the future.

Geoff went on to talk about electric vehicle charging stations and having limited driving distance controlled by availability of charging stations as BP having only one charging station in Victoria to date, so if everyone in Australia was to purchase an electric vehicle it would take thirty years before we have enough green power to re-charge them, bi – directional vehicles will be available later in the year in Australia, these vehicles charged during the day have the capacity to power your house at night. Australia doesn't have the facilities in place to recycle electric vehicle batteries or solar panels most of this is going into landfill although some countries are recycling components.

Geoff spoke about the emission tax the federal government is looking to charge for combustion engine powered vehicles, being charges incurred for distance travelled, increasing for older vehicles without fitted emission controls, road user tax on electric vehicles has been implemented in some states.

CO2 Emissions. The world is now about clean and healthy environment. Policy Advisory Groups are governed by people all under the age of 30 working towards less carbon emissions. Australia being 12 years behind Europe as no Policy exists for Federal or State Government as yet

Rear view

Drivers position (Side on view with door open)

Passenger side

Drivers side

Body and Engine numbers, stampings and plates or VIN number

Present this information to the permit scheme officers, they will do the appropriate paperwork for Vicroads.

Also remember to keep your old logbooks for 12 months.

Reports were moved by Robert Rigby. Seconded by Marjory Kissick. Carried


General Business:

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


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
