Run Organisers Information

Members, please consider organising a Club Run or Coffee Run.

Contact any Program Team member with your proposed run/s.

Club runs are usually held on the last Sunday of each month (except January and December), starting at approx. 9.30-10.00 am, and generally include morning tea (BYO), and lunch – either BYO or at a venue. Coffee runs can be BYO or at venues depending on itinerary and/or destination.

Please include entry costs that apply to any venues being visited.

Coffee runs are usually held on the 2nd Thursday of each month (February – December) with a 1-1.30 pm. departure time - this can vary depending on destination.

Runs usually depart from:

The School Bus Exchange / Strides Greyhound Club Carpark, Rubicon Street, Redan; or
the School Bus Exchange, Melbourne Road, Brown Hill; or
the former Master's carpark, 25-51 Learmonth Road Wendouree.

Itineraries/mud maps should be provided for participants on the day of the run (suggest 8+ copies).

Attendance lists are to be completed for insurance purposes. Pre-printed member lists are available from the Secretary at our General Meetings and should be returned to the Secretary after the event.

Code Red Fire Rating Days

Any Club Event which falls on a day designated Code Red is automatically cancelled.

Organisers of events may cancel on a Total Fire Ban Day if they consider it appropriate.

REPORT – Club Run

SUNDAY 23rd November 2025

CLUB Run to Mt Boninyong Homestead.

Midland Highway, SCOTSBURN VIC 3352

This is an historic homestead located in Scotsburn, built in 1884 on land first settled by Andrew Scott in 1839. The homestead was designed in the "Scottish Baronial Mansion" style by architect Henderson. It is listed on the National Trust and has local significance as a heritage-listed property.

A very well organised day under the leadership of Russell Nicholls [Nicko to his friends] commenced from the Ballarat East Bus Exchange for a picnic lunch in the gardens of Mt Boninyong Homestead.

Following our picnic lunch was the opportunity to stroll the extensive gardens.

A line up of 14 cars, following our leader Nicko who showed commendable leadership in travelling at a safe speed and selecting a safe driving route for our small convoy.

Nicko put considerable thought into planning this club run, a distance of approx. 70 kms through some beautiful undulating and picturesque countryside.

We were greeted and made to feel very welcome by the owners of the property, Graeme and Celia Burnham.

Celia is the great-great granddaughter of the property's original settlers and grew up on the Mount Boninyong property.

In 1976 she married a Riverina farmer, Graeme Burnham, and headed over the Murray River to live on a property near the New South Wales Riverina town of Moulamein.

In 1984, the Burnham couple and their three daughters moved back to the Mount Boninyong property.

Celia's father John Scott moved to a smaller property just down the road. This is a significant local heritage property and also features one of Victoria's oldest surviving gardens, originally laid out in the 1850s. Andrew Scott took up the station at 'Mt. Boninyong' which comprised 16,000 acres. Mrs. Scott was reputedly the first white woman in the area, Graeme and Celia provided a brief talk on the homestead and the family history. A standout memory is the movement of 4000 sheep from Scotsburn to Warracknabeal where the family also had property. There was also a massive movement of sheep to far north Queensland.

In the 1830's Andrew Scott walked from Melbourne to Geelong carrying his saddle and Bridle to purchase his first horse, as there were only a small number of horses in Australia at that time the price of the horse was said to equate to the value of 3 Roll Royce cars!

The visit to this remarkable property was an enjoyable and rewarding experience and we thank Nicko for his great organising.
