



#### interesting Ford facts

- 1. Ford is the second largest family owned company in the world. Henry Ford's great grandson, William Clay Ford, Jr. currently resides as the company's executive chairman.
- 2. The very first Ford sold was to Dr. Pfennig in 1903, for a grand total of \$850. The "Model A" had a 2-cylinder engine, and could reach a max speed of 30 mph
- 3. Ford's current CEO, William Clay Ford, Jr., or Bill Ford, currently owns the first Ford vehicle ever sold in 1903.
- 4. Henry Ford and Thomas Edison were lifelong friends. As requested by Ford, Thomas Edison's son captured Edison's last exhale in a test tube and sealed it with a cork. Ford kept the tube as a memorial to Edison's "life and breath."
- 5. Ford's signature blue, oval logo was not introduced until 4 years after the company had already been in production.
- 6. In 1914 Ford offered its employees double the current market average, creating Henry Ford's "\$5-a-day." The new salary, accompanied by a shorter working day and company profit sharing, minimized employee turnover, and was significant in growing the middle class and fair wages movement. Henry Ford was quoted saying he wanted to help his workers to a "life" not just a "living."
- 7. In 1964, after Ford debuted the Mustang, 94,000 pedal-powered toy mustangs were bought for children the following Christmas season.
- 8. In 1965, a Ford Mustang was transported in 4 separate pieces to the observation deck of the Empire State Building, using resident elevators, where it was reassembled and photographed by helicopter. The car was later reassembled inside the building, until it was eventually taken apart and removed from the building 5 months later.

# Shed Run 11<sup>th</sup> October


The shed run was well attended, the first shed was David North, with a few finished and a few unfinished projects for everyone to look at.

## AN OLD MG LIVES AGAIN

Many club members would have been aware of Alex Taylor's 1950s MG (in many pieces) in the premises of the former panel beating/spray painting business run by his father (also named Alex) – a restoration project that never really got o\_ the ground. I am not sure when Alex acquired the MG but one of his contemporaries (Colin Day, a former President of our club) has told me that Alex was talking about it while they were still at High School – which is a long time ago.

Without going into too much detail, Alex senior died in 1993 and the panel beating business closed. Alex junior developed other interests until he also succumbed to ill health and passed away in 2021. Members of the Taylor family agreed to donate a number of old vehicles including the MG (model TD) to the Kerang Historical Society & Museum.

The story could well have ended there, except for the talents of the team of volunteers at the Kerang Museum. These guys had already restored several old cars and were up to the task of bringing the collection of MG parts (the remains of three cars) back to life. It would be unfair to mention names because many members of the Museum group participated in the project, but K & D V M C members will recognise one of our Life Members, Don Pascoe in the 'before' photograph.

In just four years the Museum team have completed the daunting task of restoration, and the Kerang Historical Society Museum now has an excellent example of a mid-20th century English sports car on show.

The Peel P50 is a three-wheeled microcar originally made from 1962 to 1965 by the Peel Engineering Company on the Isle of Man, and then from 2010 to present.

Powered by a 4.2 horsepower engine, and reaching a top Speed of 38 mph.
