"Something Unusual"

October Tech Night

This amazing toy is an external-combustion engine that uses air as the working fluid, operating on a highly efficient thermodynamic cycle (the Stirling cycle). It was named after Robert Stirling (1790 – 1878), the Scottish minister who invented it.

The Stirling cycle is a thermodynamic cycle used in Stirling engines to convert heat energy into mechanical work. It involves four processes: heating, expansion, cooling, and compression. Instead of using an internal combustion process, Stirling engines use a closed system with a fixed amount of gas that is heated and cooled, causing it to expand and contract, driving a piston and generating power.

The Stirling cycle operates by cyclically compressing and expanding a fixed amount of gas, typically hydrogen or helium, within a sealed chamber. The cycle's distinctive feature lies in its ability to run on any external heat source, such as solar energy, biomass, or even waste heat from industrial processes, making it an invaluable solution for power generation, heating, and cooling applications.

The toy is operated by filling a cup/mug with hot water (about 100°F, though the hotter the water, the longer the engine runs.

Toby, our big Saanen goat, was on his chain, trimming the grass.


Unfortunately for Dad, Toby could reach the tractor.

YOU would be forgiven for taking a second glance at Wangoom brothers Bill and Lindsay Brodie cutting grass in their paddocks.
The dairy farmers have defied technological trends as they continue to harvest with the tractor they fashioned from a 1929 A model Ford in 1950.

Ford in 1950.

They say their veteran tractor has suffered no major problems and still runs with the same efficiency it produced when they registered it 45 years ago this month.

Bill, the senior brother by seven years, said the tractor, which towed a 1950 Massey Harris Sunshine mower, ran extremely smoothly and gave them no cause to upgrade.

"We built if from the ground up. We use it to

"We built it from the ground up. We use it to cut hay for the animals and we cut enough for about 4000 bales a year, sometimes we have a bit more," Bill said.

bit more," Bill said.
"We've always had it in the shed and there's not that much that can go wrong with these sort of things. It's a fairly simple machine."
Brother Lindsay agreed with Bill's assessment, saying ageing metal was the only major problem he had encountered.

"It's pretty good. I'd say it's stood up to the work fairly well," Lindsay said.

work fairly well," Lindsay said.
"It's had a few problems with fatigue of metal, but other than that it's kept on going. I'm looking for a few more good years.
"It's like anything that is old, if you keep them in good repair they'll keep going."
But the brothers say there is one thing they envy with modern tractors — the ability to hydraulically raise the mower.

Instead of having this convenience, the brothers have to physically pull up the cutter and screw it together to ensure it doesn't drop to the ground. However, Bill is not too fussed about this

problem.

"It's all right, you get used to it," he said.
Bill has had plenty of time to do that.

The History of the Dormobile

Dormobiles are motor caravans (camper conversions) designed by the Martin Walter Company of Folkestone, Kent, England. Most were built from 1958 through the early mid 1970's.

Martin Walter made custom caravan conversions for a variety of mostly British vehicles. These conversions were usually installed to order on new vehicles that were purchased at the same time. Customers could choose conversion components from a list of items or pay extra to have custom features fabricated. Some Dormobile conversions had as little as a pop up top or seats that fold down into a bed. Most had complete caravan interiors installed. The campervan idea originated as a compromise negotiated with the UK tax office.

Martin Walter also sold conversion kits to other companies who installed them in vehicles. Land Rover Dormobiles were available directly through North American Land Rover dealers. Some of these may have been dealer-installed by kits shipped from Martin Walter directly to the dealer. All installations performed by Martin Walter at their factory were provided with a riveted on ID tag.

There is at least one company in Southern California that installed Martin Walter pop up roofs onto Dodge window vans and added their own

camper interior during the late 1960s and early 1970s. While Dormobiles can be found across the world, most were sold in the UK and still live there. Only Land Rover and Volkswagen Dormobiles were sold into North America though a few other marque Dormobiles have been privately imported.

Vans converted under the Dormobile name included Morris Commercial Cars, VW, BMC, Land-Rover, Ford, Leyland, and Commer. Some of these early vans used for Dormobile conversions were identified by the distinctive side stripe panel, usually painted in a stand out colour. They included Bedford, The Ford Thames, Commer and Morris and Austin J4.

The first Bedford CA based Dormobile motorhome, complete with a gas stove, a sink and cupboards and seats which converted into beds, appeared in 1957. The elevating roof, hinged on one side and featuring a red and white striped canopy, was quickly evolved in order to make it possible to stand within the vehicle.

The company subsequently converted a number of different van-based vehicles to other uses, including minibuses and ambulances, before collapsing in the mid-1990s.

In 1997, Dormobile Ltd. was revived and is now based in Lyndhurst, Hampshire. The company does modern camper conversions, supplies spare parts and restores the

classic models.

That is only three editions of the newsletter away, so think seriously about taking on the task please.


Between now and then, I am happy help a new editor get started, or you may wish to forge your own path. However, after 14 April 2026 I will be focused on the Club History project.


