

Lloyd Griffith's Car Collection—Allawoona

Amazing, Incredible, Stunning are some of the many words members would be using after the trip to view this unbelievable collection on Saturday 25th October.

Despite a weather forecast of 20-40mm of rain in the area, 33 members and 5 visitors met at the Merbein South weighbridge for the 8am start. We all then caught up at the Loxton Bakery for morning tea before the 40-minute trip to Lloyd's 35,000 acre farm. Passing the homestead and a few typical outer buildings, we stopped in front of a LARGE shed, which was 3 sheds joined together. Outside was the usual collection of old farm equipment and vehicles, but upon entering the centre opening, we were greeted by the start of a massive array of engines, farm machinery from the past, several commercial vehicles and cars. A V8 Caterpillar engine (with straight out exhaust), was started just to make sure that everyone was awake & had their hearing aids in! After some time, "the second shed is opened" came the announcement, and that was when the jaws dropped, and eyes popped! Entering an area of about 1,000 square metres of insulated walls & roof and the floor covered with artificial turf, was an array of magnificent cars, from a Lamborghini Diablo to a humble Mini. Scattered were the odd Monaro & Commodore, a couple of Corvettes & Camaros, along with a Toyota Century V12 limousine with an XJS V12 to keep it company.

"The third shed is open" came the call after barely enough time to view each and every car, and we then entered the Holden Shed. Virtually every model of this once great Australian made car was on display, again including several Monaro's of each model, along with a few special Commodores. a couple of which I had not heard. Possibly the rarest was the Wayne Gardner Racing model, of which apparently only thirty-three were built. Moving to Shed 4 revealed a few vintage models, including Erskine, Maxwell, Rugby, Overland and Chandler. The big Ford F650 was certainly a standout and would be a hard vehicle to park in Langtree Ave. in front of the Grand! Included were 6-10 midget racers/TQ's fitted with various engines ranging from 500cc motorcycles, 1750 Alfa Romeo & the famous grey Holden. It was in this shed that Events Director Royston made a presentation to Lloyd. Down the road a bit was the fifth shed containing many Toyota Landcruiser's, including an FJ 25 from 1959. This was the model that kicked off Australia's love for this vehicle.

The last shed contained many motorcycles, some of which were obscure makes such as Peugeot, Ural & Motobecane.

This was a once in a lifetime experience and Lloyd is to be admired not only for his collection, but the way it is displayed and his generosity in hosting our club.


The purpose of the collection is to display, in a pictorial format, the rich and diverse history of our club for the enjoyment of members, their guests and visitors for many years to come.

If the log book is not produced, the permit renewal will not be signed!

New Vehicles for VIC club permit scheme.

All vehicles must have a certificate of roadworthiness plus photos for club records as Vicroads may request to see them.

Hard copy photos required of your car:

Front view

Rear view

Drivers position (Side on view with door open)

Passenger side

Drivers side

Body and Engine numbers, stampings and plates or VIN number

Present this information to the permit scheme officers, they will do the appropriate paperwork for Vicroads.

Also remember to keep your old logbooks for 12 months.
