Applicants for a new CPS must have been a member of the Club for a full 30 days after their Membership has been processed, which may take up to an additional 30 days. Please consider all this before booking your car for a RWC if you are looking for a CPS permit.

Applications for a car to join the VicRoads Club Permit Scheme (CPS) with a 45 or 90 day log book will require a current roadworthy certificate (RWC) issued by a VicRoads authorised mechanic. Modified cars seeking entry onto the M-plate system will be required to provide the necessary engineering certifications alongside their roadworthy certificate to be considered. The Club does NOT inspect cars or issue roadworthy notices for any CPS applications.

A one-off administration fee of \$10.00 is required for all new applications.

Applicants must provide seven (7) photos of their vehicle, taken within the timeframe of the roadworthy certificate that are dated and clearly display: 1) front of vehicle, 2) rear of vehicle, 3) driver's side of vehicle, 4) driving position (side on with driver's door open), 5) engine bay and 6) Left hand side 7)VIN/ chassis number or engine number.

All modifications on a vehicle requiring an M plate must be photographed and provided with the VASS certificate.

Complete a club permit application AND Vehicle eligibility and standards declaration (both forms obtained from VicRoads).

CPS renewals must be accompanied by a completed club permit DECLARATION form (download from the club website)

CPS renewals may be processed electronically with a Club Permit Endorsement form, contact an officer for processing.

The Club will also notify VicRoads when any member with a current Club sponsored Permit Plate becomes unfinancial.

It is the requirement of the member to ensure their vehicle remains compliant to VicRoads standards of the Club Permit Scheme.

## Car of the Month Pop's VC 1967 VC Valiant Dennis

### and Anita Setterfield

Hello to all CRCA Club Members

Our names are Dennis and Anita Setterfield and we are the proud owners and preservers of our unique and much loved family VC Valiant.


This VC was purchased second hand by my father Ernest Thomas Setterfield and has remained in the family since 1968.

Ernie (Dad) was very particular about recording details in car log books and it is from this information that I write this story.

Dad previously owned Chevys including a 1955 and 1957 model and prior to that many other types. He later moved onto a 1959/1960 Vauxhall Velox. He always maintained it was not a happy car as it had "only half a smile" because of the front grill. I learnt to drive in this Vauxhall at a young age whilst living in a NSW country rural town called Comboyne. Just one of the benefits driving on country roads back in those days, as long as you didn't get caught.

Dad and Mum were travelling through nearby Wauchope NSW, about an hour's drive from Comboyne when they spotted an eye catching vehicle in a dealers car yard, took details and contacted my eldest brother Ernest, also known as Ernie, to seek his opinion as to whether to purchase and trade in the Vauxhall. A response was quickly received to the effect "if you don't Dad I will be up there and trade my 1966 AP6 Station wagon for it. So Dad had no choice but to do it so we now had two Valiants in the family and it became a great attraction in the township of Comboyne- not being a Holden or Ford.

From Dad's records I have established the Valiant was purchased on the 1<sup>st</sup> October 1968 from Mearns Motors, Wauchope NSW Regn No EPG676 with 17242 Miles on the speedo.

Unfortunately, I wasn't a participant during this time in the purchase as I was employed by the Bank of NSW and working in Canberra. BUT did I get a huge surprise when visiting home for Christmas and Dad asked me to get the car out of our humble garage for a Sunday drive down to the Coast as I had done since I was the age of 14 and learning to drive. I was now 18 and had my ACT Licence . "WOW" was the words I uttered loudly with Dad standing not far from me. GUESS who had the privilege of driving it down to the coast "ME"


On one of Mum and Dads country trips they had stopped at a wayside stop for a coffee break and Dad noticed a Ford travelling at



speed in the opposite direction but quickly did a U-turn and came back to where they were. Dad enquired if he could help in any way but the driver replied No and that he noticed the Val and had to have a good look at it again. Dad asked why and he replied that "he was the silly bugger that sold it" to which Dad replied "then I must be the silly bugger who bought it"

Late March 1972 Mum and Dad toured south to Victoria and the Val was part of our wedding day on Easter Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> April 1972 as a Bridesmaid and Flower girls car. Dad actually drove the car and it only had 44000 + miles on the speedo. Anita and I borrowed the Val and their Viscount Caravan for our honeymoon to the Gold Coast. So they had very little time to return home to Comboyne for us to swap cars and continue on our honeymoon.

Mum and Dad moved in 1974 to Killarney Vale NSW (The Entrance/Gosford area) and again it attracted a huge amount of interest around the area.



Mum and Dad enjoyed many a holiday with the Val and C'van and in September 1980 she finally clocked up its first 100,000 miles (160900 Klm). In September 1984 they made the big decision to move to Frankston to reside in a granny flat on our house block. Thus the end of NSW Regn EPG 676 and the move to VIC Regn. CIB 488. "Val" was then nicknamed as " Chief Inspector of Bullshit" with 114603 miles on the speedo (184396 Klm)

Mum passed away in October 1990 and Dad followed in October 1992 and the following was the last entry he wrote in "HIS" record book "1992 Sept 1st Renewed set of points \$5.00 139478 miles.Frankston (7349 miles since last set.) Bought new set of points \$6.95- on hand just in case of trouble."

Following Dad's passing I inherited the Valiant.

In late 2003/early 2004 car was handed over to an auto repair shop in Cranbourne for some cancer / rust treatment and a full respray with a new vinyl roof being fitted. Car was refitted with trims and new carpet on the Wednesday prior to our youngest daughter's wedding on 14th February 2004. Our son flew in from New Zealand for the wedding and also to drive it as the Bridal car. Of course I was dad escorting daughter in the back seat to the church and then of course designated to the Mini bus for the travel to the reception.

In October 2007 Anita and I discussed as to how we could do something in respect to Dad's memory. Thus we passed on CIB 488 and Val became known as "POPSVC" on 16<sup>th</sup> October 2007 to which it is regularly referred to by us and club members to this day. ( I still have the plates and display them on club display days wherever possible)

The engine showed some wear and tear at 150060miles (241446 Klm) in September 2013 so we arranged for the original motor No VC 323024 to have a freshen up which ended up with a total rebuild.

For obvious reasons in October 2013 POPSVC was transferred to Club plates 28362H

It didn't end there as we all know parts have a habit of wearing out and in Feb/March 2024 more undercarriage mechanical
