Neil, Bob Watson, and I spent so many hours together talking about and driving Austin Sevens, and had a memorable trip to Phillip Island to help Neil compete in the first Armstrong 500 race, in a Mini.

He had a great career working for the Cooper racing TEAM IN

England, and later became involved in wine making in Australia.

Neil was a member of the 'Hand Tool Preservation Association of Australia Inc'. He took me to a couple of meetings which prompted me to write a large article on Austin 7 Tools and toolkits, later published in their newsletter.

He was fascinated by the minute detail of the variations in Spanner sets made for Austin Motor Company. - https://www.htpaa.org.au/

Neil's dad was a chain smoker with terribly nicotine stained fingers- he died relatively early from emphysema.

I remember navigating for Neil in his mother's Morris Minor. Later I remember he had a Holden- on one trial we cornered at high speed on a dirt road - up scarily high up on two wheels- crashed down - shook ourselves and pressed on. Geoff Taylor was in the back seat. It was up near Bylands - north of Melbourne.

Neil attended Caulfield Senior Technical College with myself, Bob Watson, Geoff Taylor and Glen Ferris, all graduating in 1957.

My first Austin Seven was a 1929 Utility, bought in August 1955-

After removing the utility body I gave it to Neil

The Utility after Neil sold it, for £5, in 1958, to Vaughan Gibson, aged 14.



I rebuilt the chassis and put on a complete original

1929 James Flood Austin 7 Meteor body bought from a wreckers in Oakleigh. It was similar to Stan Rodda's Meteor 'The Yellow Peril', shown

here.

We all (except for Glen Ferris) joined the Austin Seven Club in 1956, regularly attending meetings at St Silas Church Hall, Albert Park.

The club then comprised many Austin Seven names from the past such as Fred Thorne, John Pryce, Frank Walter, Trevor

Border Run 2023

Friday 15th September to Monday 18th September Bulletin No. 1

This year's Border Run for the Austin 7 Club of SA Inc and the Austin 7 Club Inc (Victoria) will be centred at Mount Gambier SA.

This first Bulletin will provide an outline of the programme so members can begin to arrange their calendars. More complete information (including pricing and booking instructions) will be provided in subsequent Bulletins.

While previous Border Run activities have effectively commenced on the Saturday afternoon upon arrival at the selected base town/city, most of the SA club members have historically travelled part way on the Friday, while those who were still on somebody else's payroll travelled the full distance on Saturday.

Some Victorian members have also travelled part way on Friday and may choose to do so again this year.

This year the SA first contingent will travel to **Naracoorte** on Friday 15th September. The option remains for others to travel direct to Mount Gambier on Saturday.

Any Victorians who would like to travel to join us at Naracoorte are most welcome to do so. Google maps indicates that it is only 14km further than the direct trip to Mount Gambier – but it is a long haul from Melbourne in one day in a "7".

As the convoy leaves Naracoorte en-route to Mt Gambier we will have a guided tour of the famous Naracoorte Caves, followed by lunch at Penola. As we pass through Nangwarry (32km north of Mt Gambier, or 130km west of Hamilton (via Coleraine and Casterton) we will stop to have a look at the Nangwarry Forestry & Logging Museum. The Victorian members can rendezvous with the SA group at Nangwarry at about 2:00pm they wish.

Two nights' Accommodation and Saturday night's dinner in Mt Gambier will be at the **Presidential Accommodation & Suites** which has been renovated since we were there about 6 years ago. Sunday night's dinner will be at the Western Tavern (3 minutes walk from the Presidential)

Sunday's run will be to Port Macdonnell, with the main feature being a visit to **Feast's Classic Car Collection and Memorabilia**, lunch, and an optional visit to **Collectormaniac Antique Store**. It won't be a big driving day – approx. 80km round trip.

Additional details will be provided in Bulletin #2 in a few weeks. No action is required from you yet.

We are looking forward to good numbers from each side of the Border, and a bit warmer weather than our previous June events.

MY AUSTIN by Richard Mitchell

Reliving my youth

I live in Sydney. Back in 1965 when I was 19 – do the maths – for reasons which are now unclear I decided to build an Austin 7. I put a classified ad for parts in the Saturday Sydney Morning Herald and received several responses. Two guys in their late 20s arrived at my home in an FJ ute and unloaded a heap of parts onto the front lawn, including a chassis and about four engines.

I also paid £5 for a much-bodged Meteor body.

I began building the car and gradually realised that I did not know what a complete car consisted of. Accordingly I bought a running 1936 Ruby for £20, disposed of its Tourer body, and replaced it with the Meteor, handling the six inch mismatch in length via some primitive mods.

Just as I completed the car I got married and that ended the project. I left the car and the heap of original parts in the back of my mother's garage and moved on in life.

When my mother died in 2000 I had to extract the car and parts to sell her house. I cleaned up the "Meteor" and resprayed it (although the 1967 vacuum cleaner spray job had held up very well). I then parked it in another garage, this time at our weekender in the Blue Mountains, and transferred the original heap of parts to under our own house on Sydney's northern beaches. We have a sloping block and there is good head height at the rear.

When Covid arrived in 2019 I decided to finally carry out another long-threatened project and lay concrete under part of the house and install some lights. The lighting revealed just how extensive the old pile of spares was. So I decided that, as a further Covid project, I would reincarnate my original youthful plan and build up an Austin 7.

Not having a body, I decided to build a special. I had two major questions – the original one of what parts were missing and a new one of what would I build the body out of?

MY AUSTIN by Stuart Steinfort

Sifting through the parts revealed that, amazingly, I seemed to have everything other than a rear end. I did have the innards of a diff, complete with rear half shafts, but no casing, hubs or brakes. Via Google I found that a Courtenay Rumble had various rear end components for sale. Some had been stored outside for many years. However I bought them and some other parts and learnt from Courtenay of the existence of the new spares stock held by the Victorian Austin 7 Club. These included an outer hub which I was still missing.

I was now able to build a complete car, albeit with mismatched brake systems at the rear.

Turning to the other question — what to build the body out of - it had to meet two main criteria - cheapness and be within my very limited skill capabilities. I decided to try ABS sheeting over a non-stressed space frame made from square steel tube.

A significant disadvantage of ABS sheet is that you cannot produce compound curves in a home environment. Non-compound curves and straight bends are relatively straightforward. You just need a hot air blower. Also, thermal welding is fairly simple.

Other advantages are that it is fairly light, it can be cut with simple hand tools – hacksaw, jig saw – and the speed of construction. With the design now finalised, I could probably build the same body again in two days. It took me about four weeks.

My effort is shown in the photos – certainly a five metre plus viewing car. I acknowledge that the rear end is somewhat aesthetically challenged.

If anyone has any semi-Girling brake parts - particularly the operating and adjusting mechanisms and cam levers - that could help me out at the rear I would be very pleased to hear from them. I have backplates and drums.
