HMVC LIBRARY REPORT

This month's 'Odd Bod' will fascinate many and may cause others to question just how safe the 'good ol' cars' they are now driving as 'historical', really are! I recall cataloguing this same title, many years ago, for the Library Service in which I was then employed.

I mentioned it to a friend in a local motor sales garage. Having read it, he told me that he was quite shocked at the findings and conclusions reached in the book, particularly those concerning the make he was then selling, and very successfully, to the public! The faults and production issues related primarily to the UK-make vehicles, as on his showroom floor (*of course in their CKD-Australian, versions*). This book, he said, could prove ruinous to the Australian motor industry. The scandals revealed weren't confined to just UK-makes, but similar faults, and even much worse, were to be found with European and US manufactured cars. Remember GM's 'Corvair', Ralph Nader, and his controversial book: 'Unsafe at any speed'?! (Your Library has a copy...).

Even after 50 years, this book still seeks answers to a range of concerns never fully addressed! Is <u>vour</u> car listed in this book, labeled by one reviewer as one revealing a 'scandal' and a 'searing indictment of the motor industry'??

READ it and see! ...a great read...

AIRD, Alastair "The Automotive nightmare." On the shelf at 301.55/AIR

BOOK of the month for July should delight HMVC Members as our own late Member, Peter Smythe, contributed original material on the 'CHIC' motor car manufactured in Clarence Park.

"SOUTH AUSTRALIAN MOTOR CARS, 1881-1942" lists alphabetically the origin and manufacturing details of all known motor vehicles produced in this State during those formative years. Many were, as the reader will discover, very 'original' in conception and operation. Some were based on readily available, imported, auto components whilst others were the product of local genius. Some were 'electrically propelled' by ranks of batteries, others by steam, but the majority used petrol 2 or 4-stroke IC engines. Experience with early vehicles, both before and during WW1, combined with demand for automobiles after the War, created the impetus leading to the appearance of many new vehicles; 'makes' with names now long forgotten in time. The years of the Great Depression were, of course, the reason for the demise of most locally made cars.

Our Library's copy is one of just 1000 books published. Please make sure that your name is entered in the Book Loans record before removing it from our Library.

MEMBER PROFILE - Andy Hislop

My enjoyment of vehicles started when my Dad had an old Morris Prefect sitting doing nothing in the back yard. Not knowing anything about mechanics, and with the help of some mates, we pulled the engine apart and rebuilt it. Great fun was had by all, until the day when we drove it down the street for the first time, it over heated and stopped forever. Lifted the bonnet up and found oil everywhere but in the engine. Apparently you had to replace that cork 'thingy', that goes between the head and block. Oh well. Dad also had Zephyr's of various models and Vanguards too. So I tinkered with them.

Early on in my Naval career, 1971, I bought a brand knew Toyota Corona from the dealership in Tanunda, for \$1,800. That thing went everywhere in the next few years, (180,000k's) till it was time for an update. Out of the Navy now and I traded it in for a Holden Torana. Another good car I had some good times in. When I parted ways with it for a Honda Accord, I was delighted. Heard from a mate who was in the dealership where I did the trade, that one of the managers took it out to Glenelg to show off to his new girlfriend that night and backed it into a stobie pole.

In 1978 I as working for PMG, then Telstra and drove Toyota vans, Ford dump trucks all over Adelaide. After that in 1980, I enlisted into the RAAF and moved 26 complete house moves, not to mention 1 year in Singapore and 2 years in Butterworth in Malaysia. My first posting was to Darwin where I was only 1 of 3 people that could still read morse code. I read morse for the Weather Bureau which came from the automatic stations around Darwin. On my days off, I would drive buses to take disabled kids to school and back, TAA & Ansett civvie aircrew to their hotels and back, and also a Denning Hino from Darwin to Alice Springs and back. Had a Kawasaki Z150 motorbike up there. Was only in Darwin for a year before I was posted again, this time 'Up Top', to Singapore.

My favourite car in Singapore was a Toyota 'Blue and White' Taxi. It went everywhere I paid the driver to take me and never failed to get me back. My oldest daughter was born there. (In Singapore, not the taxi.)



In Malaysia I had a Fiat 2300 Saloon, with the same mod-cons than my previous and future Honda Accord's had, but years in advance. Repairs were cheap from my local mechanic, and I could

buy the complete gasket set for the whole engine for less than the price it would cost me for the smallest single piece back home from Repco. Would've loved have to brought it back to Australia, it was such a great car. Still had the 'wind up and down' aircon, no complaints. (Youngest daughter was born in Penang.)

Once drove in convoy of 3 RAAF L100 vehicles and trailers around peninsula Malaysia which took us almost 4 weeks. So many great places.

From Malaysia, I was back to Aust and ended up in Canberra. It was while I was there I applied to become Aircrew and was accepted. I became a Loadmaster (the guy that does all the work down the back, while the pilots have there tea and sticky buns up the front), on the following type of aircraft: Chinook's, Iroquois UH1H, Aerospatial 350B Squirrels, Blackhawks, Hercule's C130E & H models, Dakota and other single engined aircraft.

I have been to 33 countries so far and some more than once. Like Hawaii around 12+ times. I did 2 stints with a RAAF and in between I worked for the United Nations in East Timor (twice). One day while home, I had a call from the ADF wanting me back, and so began my second stint.

Funny thing about the UN, when I was being tested by their Driver Instructor to be able to drive the UN's vehicles, he asked to see my licence, so I showed him. He was taken aback by how many licences I actually had and offered me a position in his organisation. As I already had a department to work in, I declined.

From here it is easier to just list off the vehicles I had either owned or have driven.
