Kermit's Great Adventure

Having loaded Kermit over the past two weeks, we hooked the caravan on the back on Monday 18 August and headed off. It was obvious that this was going to be a slow trip, with almost maximum weight on Kermit and the van behind.

We decided to go through Healesville and over the black spur, a great road but not entirely suited to a truck and van. The first night we spent in Wagga and who stuffed up there? We ended up at a van park between the highway and the airport, and the noise was horrific. We awoke in the middle of the night to -3 degrees and the heater not working in the van, so we packed up and headed off. It was a bit hard to see with the windscreen frozen.

We limped to the caravan park at Shoal Bay where I played musical wheels until after dark and had two tyres holding air on the LHR.

Federation Report

AGM held at Border Flywheelers Club, Barnham

We journeyed interstate for the day and attended the meeting. As you can see by the few photos, we were able to see all the wonderful exhibits in the museum at the Border Flywheelers Club. It was a wonderful place, and I recommend that you visit it if you are in the area. There was something for everyone to see.

The usual events are coming up, with the Marong Picnic - where there is a display to celebrate 80 years of Fordson tractors in Australia - the Baw Baw Picnic, and Bendigo Swap this year. The other events that have been held already are booked in for next year. All on the Federation website www.federation.asn.au. If you are unable to access it let me know and I will source it for you. At the Marong Picnic there is a special meeting to discuss the future running of Bendigo Swap at 10:30am. I hope to be attending and will report it at our next meeting.

Otherwise most problems they had last year have been addressed, and the arena fencing and surface covering will start soon and will impact on the 2025 and 2026 Swaps. We have written again to the appropriate State Minister and the Show Society, saying we will not make use of the new building and that we need more information on what the entrance gates will be changed to. We are also deeply concerned with the proposal to shift the fence to the edge of the arena grass and cover the arena with 400mm of fill in March 2026. We have also asked for a 90% reduction in the rent for 2025 and 2026 Swaps as the buildings and changes will be under construction.

BENDIGO SWAP VOLUNTEERS: A reminder that the Swap is on 15th and 16th November, with set up day Friday 14th. The Swap opens Friday morning at 8:00am and does not shut till Sunday at 6:00pm, so there are a lot of shifts to fill please. Members that volunteer receive a badge, a refreshment voucher, a pass to enter the Swap for free, and for each two hour shift worked, their club receives \$20.00.

A reminder also that the Swap is owned by Federation, which supplies the funds for the annual tour, the six picnic days, Federation runs, the funding for the Capital grants back to clubs, the trophies for events, the food and venues for the quarterly meetings of Delegates, the funds for people to attend meetings with VicRoads – Department of Transport – Insurers etc., the funds for Federation to be represented on the national stage at the AHMF meetings. Plus much much more for the movement's future and success.

AHMF UPDATE: Robert Shannon Trust. Two applications have been submitted by Federation Clubs this year. If you know of a young person restoring a

vehicle then they should start preparing an application to submit for the 2026 year. Info is on the Federation website.

Neil is still discussing better deals for Clubs Insurance with three insurance providers. This is not only to do with the payment of premiums from Clubs but also the requirements that club members and Committee have to do to ensure members are covered when arranging, attending and helping out at functions and displays

GOLDEN OLDIES TOUR 2026: Early days yet with a lot more planning to happen. Looking at starting from Marong Picnic at the end of August 2026 and then heading for the Swan Hill area for a week. More helpers to assist Anne will be made most welcome. Thank you to the Swan Hill club members who are helping with arrangements locally for the 2026 event.

And lastly this is the FEDERATION'S 55TH YEAR: They have 6 large signs made that reflect this milestone. One will be on display at our picnic.

At the AGM Kevin Holloway has retired and David Berner has been added to the committee, but the President, Secretary and Treasurer remain the same.

Batteries can be left at Rod Boreham's for collection (1 Robin Hood Way Drouin, on pallet at the road side of shed). This is the preferred location, but they can alternatively be left at the club shed.
