Toyota In The Top 5

Figures released on the makes of stolen cars last year reveal that Toyota are in the top 5. In order, the most stolen cars are: Holden Commodore, Mazda 3, Toyota Land Cruiser, Toyota Camry & Toyota Corolla. Of course, it is older models that are the target of car thieves. Land Cruisers are popular because parts are easy to sell, and complete vehicles are easy & cheap to export.

Stupid Rules?

It seems that the public service has its share of stupid people, no matter which country you look at. In the UK, owners of vintage lorries (trucks) are subject to one of the most ridiculous rules I have heard of. When these vehicles are presented for their annual inspection (roadworthy), they must be loaded.
