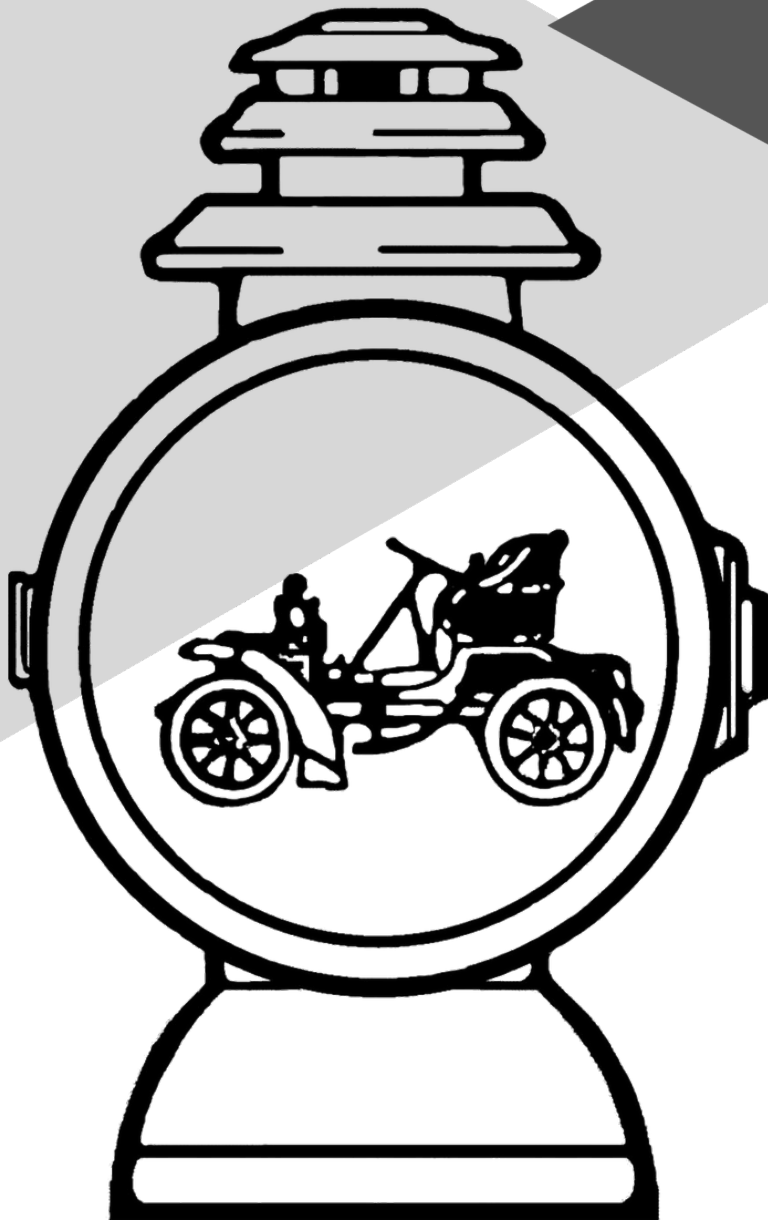

Albert Le Lievre's 1928 Leyland Truck at Temora Rural Museum



Readers may remember a sketch of a 1902 Albion buggy that I posted in our September Newsletter which I came across when browsing through a copy of the April 1968 Reflection (David Bredin's first Newsletter for the club as Editor). David has since sent us a little more information on the sketch and why it appeared in his first edition - see below>

2/10/2025

WELL, WHO WOULD HAVE THOUGHT THAT A DRAWING OF A 1902 ALBION CAR ON THE COVER OF A CLUB MAGAZINE FIFTY SEVEN YEARS AND FIVE MONTHS AGO WOULD MAKE A APPEARANCE IN THE SEPTEMBER 2025 REFLECTION.

PRIOR TO THAT SEPTEMBER 1968 MAGAZINE BEING PRINTED, TWO NEWSLETTERS HAD BEEN PRINTED AND MAILED TO CLUB MEMBERS REMINDING THEM OF COMING EVENTS AND MEETING TIMES.

BECAUSE OF THEIR SUCCESS IT WAS SUGGESTED THAT A MAGAZINE BE PRINTED. MYSELF WITH THE HELP OF TWO COOLAMON MEN CLEM LUCAS AND COLIN LUCAS WERE NOMINATED.

I DID LIKE THE IDEA OF SOMETHING ON THE COVER TO INDICATE THAT IT WAS A MOTOR CLUB MAGAZINE. ONE PICTURE STOOD OUT, RIGHT SIZE ABOUT HALF A PAGE, EASY TO TRACE AND RIGHT AGE SO THE 1902 ALBION APPEARED.

THE LIGHT IN THE PICTURE HAD NOTHING TO DO WITH THE CLUB BADGE. I THINK THE BADGE HAD BE DESIGNED BY THEN. MY DIARY HAD NOT STARTED AT THAT TIME BECAUSE MY 1928 CHEVROLET WAS STILL A WORK IN PROGRESS.

THE LIGHT ALSO HAD NOTHING TO DO WITH THE LEADING LIGHT TROPHY. THAT IS ANOTHER STORY INVOLVING BILL HANRAHAN WHO WAS EDITOR IN LATER YEARS.

I BELIEVE THAT MOST OF THE WWVVMC INC. MAGAZINES HAVE BEEN TRANSFERED TO SOME SORT OF MODERN CONVENIENT APPARATUS THAT CAN BE VIEWED IF ANYONE IS INTERESTED IN READING THEM.

KEY POINTS FROM CHMC MEETINGS, Cowra, 25 October 2025.

AGM

- **FINANCIAL REPORT** – CHMC is in a healthy financial position.
 - CHMC Treasurer to be our Public Officer forATO procedures.
- **2026 MEETINGS**
 - **Delegates - 21 March 2026** at Club Macquarie, Boolaroo. Plus, Lake Macquarie dinner cruise option, bookings essential to: rjives1@bigpond.com (NDVCCC hosting).
 - **Delegates and AGM - 24 October 2026** at Armidale Bowling Club (CSCCA hosting).
- **REGISTRARS REPORT** – 94 clubs; 8,000 members; and 9,000 registered historic and classic vehicles.
- **ELECTIONS** – as per Constitution, 3 positions this year. Confirmed: Vice President – Ray Ives; Secretary – Christine Hilbrick-Boyd; TFNSW Liaison Officer – Peter Wright.

DELEGATES MEETING Presentations and discussions on:

- **CHMC RALLY SURVEY & PROPOSAL** – recommendations for updating the Annual Rally into a simpler, less onerous event for host clubs, while fulfilling members' Annual Rally expectations. Moved that CHMC Annual Rally be held the 3rd weekend in May, that is - National Motoring Heritage Day. Carried.
- **DIRECT ACCESS FOR CLUBS TO CVS APPLICATIONS** – CHMC proposal to TFNSW that Approved Clubs be able to directly approve vehicles for either HVS or CVS.
- **LOG BOOKS RECOMMENDATION** – the NSW peak bodies, CMC, HMA and CHMC agreed to recommend that, “*All clubs advise their members to record all vehicle use in the HVS/CSV vehicle's log book*”, thus avoiding administrative work for clubs involved in complying with Condition G094 Club Runs. Moved: CHMC support that all vehicle use is recorded in the vehicle's HVS/CSV log book. Carried.
- **JOTFORM RENEWAL** – Clubs can submit vehicle census statistics post membership renewals by later sending a Jotform in with the vehicle numbers.
Historic military vehicles added to the CHMC Census to provide data for Council's advocacy efforts with TFNSW on behalf of military vehicles.
- **2025 YOUTH AWARDEE**, Lachlan Holgate from Wagga Wagga Veteran & Vintage Motor Club, displayed his 1952 Willys jeep restoration project and talked about the work he's done on it, and how he used the CHMC Grant. Lachlan was formally awarded his 2026 Youth Award Certificate. Delegates much appreciated the opportunity to meet Lachlan and see his vehicle.
- **“WHY WOULD THEY JOIN A CLUB, WHY WOULD THEY STAY?”** – research-based talk on what people look for in clubs; evolving club cultures; critical generational insights; encouraging younger people, what works; reaching and staying in touch – social media; challenges for historic vehicle clubs; and clubs that attract new members.

Thank you for all club members who made the day run smoothly.

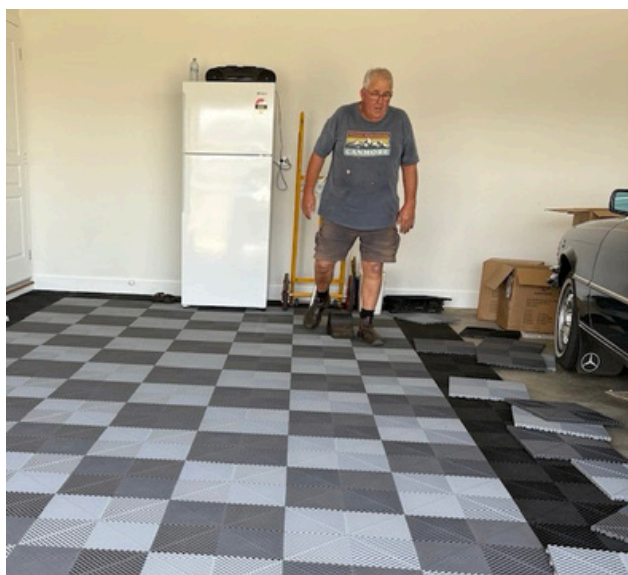
