

Caterpillar of Australia Day

Saturday 24 May

It is a big year for Caterpillar, with 2025 marking 100 years of the Caterpillar company when crawler manufacturers Holt and Best merged using Holt's trademark name. The firm has become one of the world's greatest known makers of earth moving equipment and power source for trucks, generators, locomotive, marine and manufacturing all types of machinery.

The Antique Caterpillar Machinery Owners Club have had a strong presence at most rallies this year to celebrate the 100th anniversary of the company, taking the 1914 Holt 75 to the Korumburra Working Horse and Tractor Rally this year for that.

I was approached by Glen Slocombe, secretary/treasurer of ACMOC and product manager for William Adams Caterpillar, who asked if they could have the Holt 75 for their 100 year celebratory function at Caterpillar's Australian facility at Tullamarine. I agreed, but it had to work in with an ankle replacement I was due to have done on April 23.

The Holt 75 was picked up on April 16 and taken to Tullamarine and placed in Caterpillar of Australia's apprentice training building, with bollards and bunting around it. It attracted a lot of attention there and was used as a backdrop for a group of Asia Pacific apprentices who were finishing their training.

The main celebratory function was for employees past and present, including families, and was held on the Saturday 24 May. On the day, myself on crutches, Barb, Jeff, Evan and Emma with our security passes joined the Caterpillar employees for a very enjoyable day.

They had a good display of new equipment, even a small excavator in a sand pit for young ones to have a go at. A few other early machines were on display, as well as viewing of three large natural gas-powered generators all for training, and all the other transmission, engines etc all set up for training purposes. The Tullamarine site is also the location of spare parts distribution, and a mini bus took people there to view the automatic robot selection and distribution centre - totally amazing.

Jeff started the Holt 75 two times on the day, and they supplied a very good meal in the cafeteria.

They used to build road graders at this site and had many photos of this. Many people visiting on the day came from that time, reliving what their involvement was.

All family members thoroughly enjoyed the day, and the Holt 75 arrived back to our shed safe and sound on the following Friday.

Arriving home after the ankle replacement, I had set up my old Meccano with a few additions over the years - an old ammo box full found at the old Bayles tip, another two lots from garage sales many years ago, and an army tank building kit found two weeks before my surgery.

Upon renewal, please photocopy your renewal form for club records and ensure the club has hard copy photographs of your vehicle. Required <u>date stamped</u> photos are:

- front - rear - driving position (side on, door open)

- passenger side - driver side - body and engine number stampings and plates Permit registration renewals are to be signed by club signatories at <u>club meetings only</u>. Please do not approach them at their workplace or home, except in a pre-arranged emergency situation.

Club Signatories: Ross Watson or Rod Boreham (<u>club meetings only</u>) Please remember that club permit holders must always remain financial members of the club. Yearly membership fees need to be received no later than June 30.
