Welcome members to a new year for the club, I hope you all had a nice relaxing time with family and friends over the Xmas New Year break. I look forward to the coming events for this year. I would like to thank Leonie, Jenny, Gail, Peter, and Royston for the effort they put in for Bill Bennett's wake on behalf of the club a job well done.

I read this article from another clubs magazine felt I should alert members to be aware when dealing with health issues and your licence.

How you can lose your driver's licence without being aware you've lost it!

As reported in the GOLDFIELDS Gazette:

This is a true story! (more stories on this topic can be found on the internet) My friend has been under the care of various medical specialists over the past few years, and has undergone various surgeries, stress tests, etc., some of which were reportable to VicRoads who required regular review reports to be sent to them. The specialists complied - emailing reviews to VicRoads after his appointments, and all seemed OK ... UNTIL a recent road-side Police check in December 2022. At 68 years of age and without losing a single demerit point in his 50 years of driving, he was booked for UNLICENCED driving. The police check revealed that VicRoads had SUSPENDED his licence on 7th July 2021, (2.5 years ago) claiming that they had not received a copy of his medical review due in May 2021. On following this up, my friend's specialists say they emailed it ... VicRoads say they never received it ... with VicRoads advising that it was the driv-

er's responsibility to ensure that VicRoads received the reviews. He is a farmer living out of town. He cannot drive any vehicle on public roads to his outlying paddocks to attend his stock until he attends court – facing the likelihood of a hefty fine, being barred from driving for a period of time and maybe having to re-sit the driver licence test if it is cancelled by the court. But that's not all - when his wife drove "their" car to work a day or two later, she was pulled over following a police Number-Plate Recognition check, questioned and underwent additional road-side tests ... all because the NPR check showed that the vehicle was registered to an unlicensed driver.

To safe-guard your licence, ask your medico's / others to copy you into any emails they send to regulatory bodies on your behalf, then PRINT and FILE your copies for future reference (as computers/ phones can fail when you least expect it). If you complete paper forms, copy them before sending to them to VicRoads by registered mail, or if you hand deliver them, ask for a receipt.

This would also apply to NSW's members as well.

Members with vehicles on the Club Permit Scheme must remember to produce their vehicle log book (for the previous year) to the Club Permit Officer / Registrar when requesting club verification for the following permit period.

If the log book is not produced, the permit renewal will not be signed!

New Vehicles for club permit scheme.

All vehicles must have a certificate of roadworthiness plus photos for club records and Vicroads.

Hard copy photos required of your car:

Front view

Rear view

Drivers position (Side on view with door open)

Passenger side

Drivers side

Body and Engine numbers, stampings and plates or VIN number

Present this information to the permit scheme officers, they will do the appropriate paperwork for Vicroads.

Also remember to keep your old logbooks for 12 months.



PSYCHE PUMPS

Psyche Pump Station was built in 1891 by the Chaffey brothers to meet the needs of the irrigation settlement. Water was pumped from the Murray River to

Kings Billabong and then distributed throughout the area via a series of channels.

The steam-powered pump was replaced in 1959 by an electric pump.

The original pump house still stands at Psyche Bend, complete with the restored original pump, and is the oldest pump configuration of its type in the world.

The steam-powered pump will be operating on Easter Sunday.

LANGTREE HALL MUSEUM

Langtree Hall was built in 1889 and was

Mildura's first public hall. Originally in Langtree Avenue, over the years it has been used for a variety of purposes. Band recitals, concerts, operettas, and dramatic performances by local and visiting performers were an early feature. Langtree Hall is now situated at 79 Walnut Avenue and it was once called the 'Lyric Theatre'. Since being moved to its present location in Walnut Avenue, the hall has been restored and established as a privately-owned museum by the Cornell family. It has a stunning collection of district memorabilia. It is open Wednesday, Friday and Saturday 11am to 4pm
