For vehicles pre 1948, a vehicle safety report signed by an authorized Vehicle Safety Check Officer as appointed by the Club or a roadworthy certificate. Vehicles post 1948 a Roadworthy Certificate. As it is better for the owner to personally collect the new plates from VicRoads the application should be accompanied by a stamped self addressed envelope and no payment need be included.

From the President

Hello! Another month gone, and time again to put pen to paper for the Presidents report – as I think about what to write I wonder if anyone reads this – do let me know

Earlier in the year we ran a members survey and I thought I'd share a summary: Overall we had 123 responses to the survey, the majority being long term members with 60% greater than 10 years, 14% between 5 & 10 years, 25% between 1 & 5 years and a couple less than a year.

There was a fairly even spread of attendance at our members meetings between regular attendance, occasional, only once or twice and members who had never attended. In general, the main reason for members not being able to attend more often was living too far away (60%) or other conflicts/too busy (25%). The majority of respondents had either no-opinion or wanted no change to the meeting topics. Display cars, guest speakers and socialising came out on top of what respondents wanted to see more of whilst apologies and raffle were top of the "do less" list.

In terms of feedback relating to our magazine and events, the vast majority of respondents were very satisfied, with an average score of 4.6 and 4.3 respectively (out of 5) and some great feedback about what members like together with a few suggestions.

The top two reasons for joining the club were socialising and driving events (which is lucky for a car club) and whilst a lot of respondents were unable to help with club activities approximately 50% offered to provide some form of help – which is great – thanks!

Overall, the results were very positive, with no major areas needing change and a number of helpful suggestions thanks again to everyone who provided their input!

Known for his stoic and cheery attitude in the face of several health issues in recent years, Howard faced several brain surgeries and a bypass. All of which he survived brilliantly.

I first met Howard, his family and his Dodge 4 on the 1967 combined club Hub rally in Albury, and we have been good friends ever since.

Howard was born in Rupanyup and went to school in Ballarat. His father built the Titanic bandstand memorial in Ballarat. He served in the air force as a National Service man and learned to fly Tiger moths. He became a pharmacist at a time when you did an apprenticeship. He took over the actual Pharmacy where he did his training on the corner of Bridge Rd Richmond. This became a meeting place later for many Vintage enthusiasts where talk was only interrupted by the need to fill out prescriptions.

As a committee member and very active participant in all club events he was president twice and he played a pivotal role in steering the club during the period 1960s to 1990s. It is well considered that his influence and wisdom significantly contributed to the development of the club.



Post his presidency Howard became interested in Healey's and was elected to president of that club where his talents were also evident.

Within our club Howard mentored the club library at the Westgarth street club rooms He was the entrepreneur of the Sydney overnight dash to Melbourne and other feats inspired by Wizard Smith.

Howard was a keen sportsman and was always a participant in the many inter club matches and competitions (including boat races on Albert Park Lake) between our club and the Veteran and Classic car clubs.

For many years he was the announcer at Kalorama where he expounded a good knowledge of old cars and displayed a good relationship with other clubs. He was well liked and respected on an interclub basis.

His love of cars continued with him in recent years with his BMW Z3, its predecessors being Healey, Riley 9, Talbot, and others.

Vale - Barry Ponchard



He completed an apprenticeship as an electrician, at one time working for CIG designing the first DIY welders and then a 20 year career as a technical teacher. Marrying in 1960, they moved to a one acre block in Research to raise their four children and here Barry had a suitable place to pursue his passion for collectible cars and became something of a wheeler dealer. Oldest son Michael is sure that at one time he counted 23 cars and wrecks on the property which was hotly denied by Barry. Treasures such as Sunbeam, Vauxhall, Essex, Bean, Amilcar, Jaguar, Riley

and Morgan to name a few. Barry's first of three pre war series 1Morgan 4/4s is still with the family. Barry joined our club in 1972 and was part of a small group of enthusiasts carrying out comprehensive road tests of members cars to a common formula and reporting the results in the Vintage Driver.

Also, an enthusiastic member of the VSCC he competed in events such as Templestowe Hillclimb, Geelong Sprints and Arthurs Seat Hillclimb. This month's cover car is a 1923 Columbia tourer owned by Neil Worme of Elmore Victoria. Columbia was a well thought of assembled car of its era and keen pricing saw a good number of buyers. Columbia Motors were based in Detroit and originally had been established to manufacture electric vehicles during the brass era. Switching to internal combustion engines for the twenties.

Two models were offered, and both were powered by a six cylinder Continental engine which would have seen acceptable performance when most vehicles of its day were equipped with four cylinder power units. This engine had a capacity of 3.7 litres rated at 23 horsepower. Transmission was by Durston sliding gear type transmission, clutch by Borg and Beck, Gemmer steering box, Stromberg carburettor fed by Stewart vacuum system.

It is suggested that in 1923 Columbia produced 3000 units.

Disc wheels were an available option. It also incorporated thermostatically controlled radiator shutters from around 1920, this device opened as radiator temperature increased. Columbia was one of the first marques to offer this device.





In 1923 Columbia purchased the Liberty marque to expand the company production facility, but it was soon all over for the Columbia company as it shortly went out of business

Locally at least eleven Columbia's have been registered in Victoria. I can find no record of a Victorian dealership but there was a dealer listed for Brisbane.

Tom is going to make all new bearings for the engine for us. So, while that is all happening, we will get everything finished and hopefully when we get the engine back it will be the last thing to be done. The main thing to be done now is to finish repairing the front guards and painting them.

I will also give the headlights and cowl lights some TLC so they can go on.

In 1987 The club took part in a Sunraysia National Rally a hub rally based in Mildura.

This event catering for both vintage and veteran vehicles attracted one hundred and fifty entrants of which our club provided fifty four entrants.

The concept of a national rally was established in 1965 and was organised by the Veteran club of NSW. The Veteran clubs of Australia appear to have been the organising body for these events and for this one they appear to have taken the lead. Our club provided the assistant rally director Gil Taylor.

The event started on a Sunday and went for five days.

I have recently viewed the information provided to entrants, impressive indeed. Each entrant received a thirty three page itinerary in the format of a magazine. This included entrants list, entrants' accommodation list. As well a list of participating clubs was provided. Some twenty seven clubs had members participating as well as the Veteran club interstate branches.

This really impressive publication served as the rally directory and included full details of each day's routes and activities.

The overall rally arrangements look extremely professional with at least twenty five benefactors many local but including the Shell company! Support was obtained for the event from the local municipality with a welcome from the town clerk/chief executive.

The organisers had set up a rally directors office at a local accommodation venue and a location for trailer parking.

The rally director made some interesting comments concerning the future of such events including catering for an ageing population and the hub rally format versus touring event

As well he noted how even at that time there was a change in the current generation's identifying with our cars. Further he was not sure how much longer the concept of a national rally for vintage and veteran vehicles will continue.

From this writer's point of view, it was a great way to showcase our vehicles.





Last Month's Mystery Vehicle

Last month's mystery was somewhat unusual. A result of the ambitious Charles Nash trying to cover all price categories

The Ajax was a short lived American automobile brand manufactured by the Nash Motors Company of Kenosha, Wisconsin, in 1925 and 1926. Based on a Lafayette design of the early twenties., that company had been bought out by Nash.

The Ajax came standard with a 170 cu in (2.8 L) L-head Nash straight-six engine with a seven main bearing crankshaft, force-feed lubrication system, three-speed transmission, four-wheel brakes (at that time unusual for a car of its price), steel disc wheels, as well as mohair

velvet upholstery and an electric clock. The Ajax Six produced "genuine 60 mph" (97 km/h) driving.

The Ajax was produced in the newly acquired Mitchell Motors Company plant in Racine, Wisconsin. The Mitchell

company had gone broke. And Charles Nash bought their manufacturing plant. In 1926, all Ajax models were converted into Nash Light Sixes.



The Nash was a known and respected automobile brand that was also the name of the company's founder. Production was stopped for two days while Nash hubcaps, emblems, and radiator shells were trucked to Racine where all unshipped Ajax brand cars were converted into Nash badged automobiles. Likewise, changeover kits were sent to dealers to retrofit all unsold cars by removing the Ajax badges such as those found on the hubcaps. However, some cars included "Ajax Six, Nash-built" on the Moto-Meter label and an Ajax Motors logo on the serial number tag.

Nash even made the kits available at no charge to consumers who bought Ajax cars, but did not want to own an orphaned make automobile, to protect the investment they had made in a Nash Motors product.[14] Because of this, few unmodified original Ajax cars have survived.

Notes of the AOMC Delegates Meeting. Saturday August 16th, at 1.00pm Venue: Maldon Vintage Machinery & Museum

There were 71 attendees representing 55 clubs. There were also 16 apologies submitted.

VicRoads/CPS Report: Keith Mortimer reported that on 20 May 2025, members of the AOMC and Federation executive committees met with VicRoads staff. The main focus was VicRoads' early proposal to improve the online permit renewal system. This new system aims to help club secretaries better track members' permit renewals, simplify the renewal process for permit holders, and reduce secretaries' workload through online membership endorsements. The proposed solution centres on a digital approach where clubs endorse renewals before they become due, enabling members to pay for their renewals online. Permits that have not been endorsed by the club will remain ineligible for renewal, consistent with the current process. VicRoads is still developing this proposal and the supporting online system and will continue to consult with peak bodies as the project progresses.

The meeting also considered electronic logbooks via the VicRoads app, including the possibility of a transition period where both paper logbooks and the app would be available. Work is ongoing to ensure end to end process is understood and all stakeholders are engaged appropriately.

Questions from the floor: Are VicRoads planning to introduce custom plates? Keith responded that this was not on the table at present.

Brenton Stephen (Echuca District HVC) asked if everything is going digital, as there are permit holders who do not have access to digital technology? Keith responded that they are looking at this as an option, not as an exclusive system. He also noted that AOMC and VicFed have raised similar concerns at their joint meetings with VicRoads.

Dennis Dawson (Hamilton & District HVC) Asked about the possibility of getting a short permit for moving vehicles? Not all collector cars have permits and need to arrange when moving. Keith responded that this has not been raised in discussions but is happy to take on board and raise with VicRoads.

Apprentice & Business Support Grants: These were launched at the May meeting. Keith urged delegates to take this back to their clubs and encourage applications from businesses that supply vital services to clubs. Full details on the grants are available on the AOMC website.

The first awards will be made on Saturday October 18th at the Club & Trade Showcase being held at Penrite's headquarters in Dandenong Sth.

Treasurer's Report: Mark Fenton reported that as of 31st July 2025 AOMC has \$281,009 cash at bank with \$9735 outstanding from membership and MembershipPLUS invoices due.

This year's invoicing has been done a little differently to address concerns that clubs were not receiving the invoices sent, and this seems to have been more successful this year, so thank you for making your payments more promptly this year. We will continue to send reminders about outstanding invoices but this has not been as problematic as previous years.

There have however been some payments that are not able to be identified, so if you keep receiving reminders about an invoice you believe has been paid then please contact Howard in the AOMC office to see if any of these payments belong to your club.

This year sees the start of the MembershipPLUS affiliation program and this has introduced some new office accounting and communication processes which seem to be working well. A separate report on the MembershipPLUS launch will be presented later in the meeting.

The annual financial reporting is now under way to present at the next AGM with no expected concerns, while BAS reporting is up to date and tax returns will be prepared in due course.

Overall, we remain in a strong financial position to fund ongoing activities including the launch of the AOMC MembershipPLUS Insurance scheme and other programs identified in our strategic plans.

Keith Mortimer acknowledged the work that Mark puts in as treasurer.

AOMC Events 2025: Club & Trade Expo Saturday October 18th. Last year we used Shannons Showrooms and invited clubs to promote themselves and opened up to the general public. That event was reasonably successful, and participants were surveyed to find out what could be done better. Penrite attended that event as a participant and have offered their facility to host the event this year. Last year there were 15 clubs and 25 traders displaying. This year there can be more





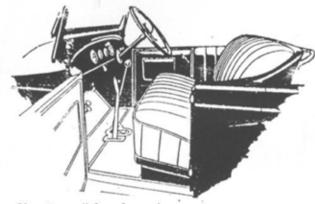
