

THE EAGLE CHAIRLIFT AND CAFE RUN

The Eagle Café and chairlift was a perfect destination for a Sunday club run. It was so nice to be out and about on what turned out to be a great day weather wise. Not too sunny, not windy (for a change), and warm enough to sit outside and enjoy the view.

About 8 cars set off from Baxter Tavern, with another 4 cars meeting us there. Most of us chose to take the more scenic drive via Moorooduc Highway up to Red Hill, then along the top of the ridge to Arthurs Seat. Such a pretty drive that never ceases to impress.

Being a Sunday it was fairly busy with tourists and we managed to all find car spots, albeit not together. The Eagle Café offers plenty of dining options with picture perfect views from almost every table, either inside or out on the expansive deck and the Base Station provides





a great spot for a quick snack or cold drink to go.

There is the Eagle Gift Shop to browse locally inspired and made giftware or grab a fun souvenir to remember your visit by. Some members rode the chairlift with family members, and other simply enjoyed the views and morning tea.

The Chairlift ride takes you 314 metres above sea level to the summit of Arthurs Seat. The perfect spot to discover local wildlife, take in more breathtaking scenery or relax and enjoy an Eagle Picnic Package. A return trip takes approximately 30 minutes but you could stay all day exploring the nearby walks within the Arthurs Seat State Park, as did a few of our members later in the day.





About Arthurs Seat Eagle 1960: The Arthurs Seat Chairlift opened in

1960: The Arthurs Seat Chairlift opened in December. It was built by Dr Vladimir Hayek, a Czech engineer.

2006: The chairlift was unfortunately closed and decommissioned after a series of mishaps including the collapse of a pylon in 2003, an injury to an elderly woman whose carriage slid into another carriage in 2004, and the trapping of eight people after a mechanical failure in 2006.

October 2009: The State Government called for tenders to build a new chairlift.

October 2010: Skylift awarded tender. **June 2014:** Council approved the project subject to 70 conditions.

November 2014: Save Our Seat Inc challenged council decision at VCAT.

December 2014: VCAT approved project.

October 2015: Construction commenced in October 2015 and was completed on 5 September 2016 at a cost of \$20 million.

April 2016: Planning Minister 'calls in' the project, removing the responsibility from Mornington Peninsula Shire Council.

December 2016: Official opening date of December 3rd. Arthurs Seat Eagle briefly went into administration in March 2020 when Covid caused it to shut down, although it is now operational again.


Interesting Chairlift Facts

- -The ride has 24 gondolas.
- Each gondola can hold eight guests.
- -The summit is 314m high.
- -The flight takes about 15 minutes each way.
- -There is 120 tonnes of steel in the towers.
- -The gondolas were manufactured in Switzerland.
- -The tallest tower is 19m from the ground to rope level.
