The ATF-Acetone mix was a "home brew" mix of 50 - 50 automatic transmission fluid and acetone.

Note: The "home brew" was better than any commercial product in this one particular test. A local machinist group mixed up a batch and all now use it with equally good results.

### 33rd Annual Speed Week

Mate Bob Kovac & I made the trip to lake Gairdner for this annual event, which has been plagued with Covid & flooding rains over the last few years. This event is Australia's equivalent to Bonneville in the USA. The 750km trip is certainly worth it, even the last 150km of rough, dusty road. Camping is the popular option, with many caravans & motor homes sited. We swagged it and catered for ourselves, as many do. There is a canteen overlooking the lake which provides all meals and refreshments at reasonable prices, certainly better than those of AFL games! There is no mobile service, so all transactions are good old cash.

We had several friends entered with machines from a 1955 175cc Jawa motorcycle, to a 1997 Ford Thunderbird ex NASCAR. The most impressive vehicle was the VR Commodore of Lionel West, now powered by a 596 cubic inch Chev racing engine boosted with Nitrous Oxide. He is chasing 300mph, having previously run 270.

Monday dawned overcast and racing commenced at 8.30am and runs throughout the day. There are 2 tracks, the first for motorcycles limited to 175mph, and cars to 150mph, 3 miles long; the second is for un-limited speed and is 8 miles long. (As with most speed events, miles is still the unit used.) Both the Thunderbird & Commodore easily ran their first required run at 150mph. The Jawa had 2 runs, setting the record at 70mph and our mate called it a day. At about 4 pm, rain started and the track was closed for the day. Late that night, a fierce thunderstorm struck, with dawn revealing a real lake, covered with about 6mm of water. No racing took place and it was doubtful if there would be any on Wednesday, so many packed up, including Bob & I, and headed home. It was a shame, as this event is unique in Australia, and a great experience. Rig.

We also welcome back vehicle entertainment and activities for the whole family.

Having an exhibition space at the Show & Shine is a terrific opportunity for your club to gain excellent exposure and we are delighted that you have taken up the opportunity to join us.

### **Event Overview**

Bump In: This will be between 6:00am and 8:30am. MCH event organisers will advise participants of specific bump in times closer to the event. No vehicles will be permitted to enter after 8:30am.

Event: Show & Shine from 9:00am to 1:00pm, all vehicles must remain STATIONARY during this time. Fines apply for moving before instructed by Event and Traffic Management.

Bump Out 1:15pm till 2:00pm. Local Laws will issue fines for any cars remaining after the roads have reopened.

All bump-in and bump-out will be overseen by Event Management and Traffic Management teams.

MCH event organisers will supply the Club Event Marshall with an event run sheet at the Event Briefing.

### Important Information for Club Exhibitors

### **Public Liability Insurance**

All Clubs will provide a Certificate of Currency as provided by your insurer or insurance advisor. The Certificate of Currency must include the following:

- Indicate that cover is provided for the period of the event
- A minimum cover of \$20 million
- Describe the nature of the business (the description must match the nature of the activity you will be undertaking at the event)
- Indicate that the premium has been paid
- Coverage extends to events

### Oil/Fluid Containment

Participants must manage all oil/fluid leaks from vehicles by using a drip tray, cardboard or other vessel when stationary. Clubs will be invoiced for any hazardous spills requiring cleanup post event.

### **Electrical Equipment**

All electrical equipment is to be fitted with earth leakage circuit breakers and all electrical leads, tools and appliances must be inspected and tagged by a licensed electrical contractor prior to the event. Any exhibitor who does not comply will not be permitted to exhibit in the event.

### **Gas Cylinders**

Must have a current stamp of approval.

### **Prohibited Goods**

No glass is allowed on site.

### Security and Safety

Exhibitors are responsible for adequately securing making safe their property and that of their staff and accompanying persons and the Mildura City Heart accepts no responsibility for damage, theft or injury.

Body and Engine numbers, stampings and plates or VIN number

Present this information to the permit scheme officers, they will do the appropriate paperwork for Vicroads.

Also remember to keep your old logbooks for 12 months.

### PSYCHE PUMPS

Psyche Pump Station was built in 1891 by the Chaffey brothers to meet the needs of the irrigation settlement. Water was pumped from the Murray River to

Kings Billabong and then distributed throughout the area via a series of channels.

The steam-powered pump was replaced in 1959 by an electric pump.

The original pump house still stands at Psyche Bend, complete with the restored original pump, and is the oldest pump configuration of its type in the world.

The steam-powered pump will be operating on Easter Sunday.

### LANGTREE HALL MUSEUM

Langtree Hall was built in 1889 and was

Mildura's first public hall. Originally in Langtree Avenue, over the years it has been used for a variety of purposes. Band recitals, concerts, operettas, and dramatic performances by local and visiting performers were an early feature. Langtree Hall is now situated at 79 Walnut Avenue and it was once called the 'Lyric Theatre'. Since being moved to its present location in Walnut Avenue, the hall has been restored and established as a privately-owned museum by the Cornell family. It has a stunning collection of district memorabilia. It is open Wednesday, Friday and Saturday 11am to 4pm
