- Steve Garwood reported that he had secured a Victorian Flag and it was at present with Emma Kealy
- Alan Jolley reported on the recent Naracoorte Tour. The Jolleys, Brodys and Barnards were represented from WMHVS. 30 vehicles / 60 people - Good Run
- Alan Cannane reported on the Murtoa Big Weekend - great turnout, atmosphere
- Terry Pollock (2024 Swap Director) gave an update on preparation getting under way for our 2024 Swap. We have a Swap Committee consisting Terry, Rob Binns, Russell Davies and Nev Thomas, who will meet regularly from now on.
- Don Perry gave an events update. Members should check the events calendar in our Newsletter as its updated monthly. Run to Wartook Wagon Museum, Coffee at Dimboola, motorcycle run to Nhill, Christmas at Rocklands all on the agenda
- Nev Thomas reported on the recent Antique Motorcycle Club Run – organized by club member Kevin Hutchinson to the Horsham area. 27 pre 1930 motorcycles from Vic and SA enjoyed the weekend.
- Alan Jolley reported that he would be attending the Federation Meeting at Echuca this coming Saturday and asked members present if they had suggestions he was happy to take on board. There has been a slight hold up with Bendigo Swap Paperwork, but it was under control and would be sent to site holders in the next week or so.
- Dean Robertson reported that he had looked briefly at the impending tax situation involving recent Govt. changes that might affect our Club. Not a lot to be concerned about at this point.

General Business : Bruce Brody (who attended the recent Naracoorte Weekend Rally) has been asked if our club, the WMHVS, would be interested in hosting an inter Club Rally in 2025. One of the Clubs normally involved with Naracoorte has indicated they will not be able to continue. Nev Thomas pointed out that for many years our own Club hosted a weekend event our 'Annual Tour' where many members from other clubs were encouraged to take part. The feeling from the floor was very positive, however, it was decided to take the proposal to our November Meeting before making a decision.

Federation Meeting 2023

This Federation Meeting was held at Echuca and District Vehicle Club rooms The President Ken Wilson welcomed 80 members from clubs around Australia for an impressive lunch and meeting. The host club is similar to our club with 200 members ranging from veteran to classic cars and motorcycles. A very modern building with wall to wall memorabilia with photos of members cars.

Points covered Robert Shannon Trust. This trust encourages under 25yr olds to assist in their restoration. Toby Thomas is restoring a 1947 Triumph 1800 roadster. With a special request his grant was increased from \$1000 to \$2000 to assist in reconditioning his brake system. Application forms are available from Federation.

An interest has developed in electric vehicles modification and its effect on vehicle VSB14 and registration Clubs will have to research Taxation needs for 2024 A digital reading and possible consult an accountant may be necessary.

Federation membership is to remain the same as last year at \$100.

Horsham Swap Meet flyer is to be sent to Federation secretary for inclusion in promotion.

No VicRoads reps present at Gisborne to meet with AOMC and Federation to discuss red plate problems. What age can you own a vehicle? It was established at 16 for a car and 18 for a motorcycle for club red plate registration.

Damage has been done to vehicles because they think it is adding to global warming. Our % is extremely low and is not the problem.

An application was made to council for \$20000 reimbursement for loss due to the cancellation of 2022 Bendigo Swap. This was declined by the council and stated that the Swap had little financial gain for Bendigo economy??? All sites taken at Bendigo Swap and 60 people are on waiting list. Local council have set rules that no pegs are to be in grounds.

Several grants were applied for but many were not in attendance to support their application.

Marong picnic was excellent success with 330 vehicles attending and \$400 in prizes presented.

Mortlake picnic (a great family) 25/8/2024 next year will receive a \$3000 boost from local Shire

36 vehicle left Marong picnic to complete a tour of flood effected areas north of Bendigo

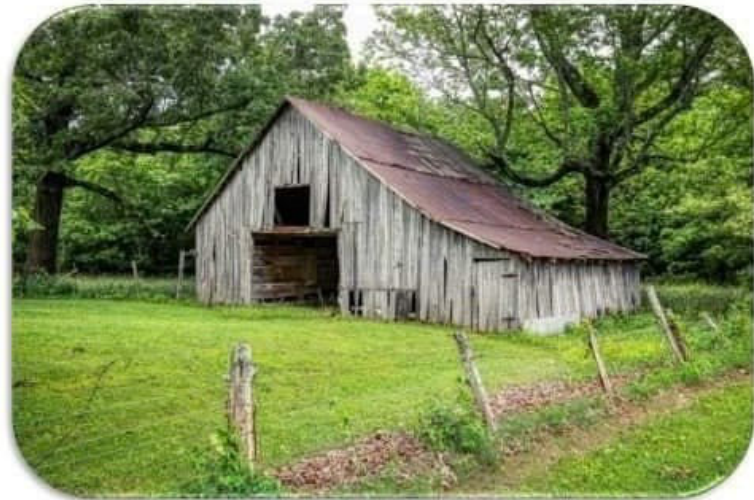

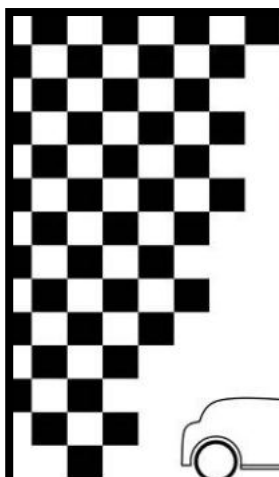

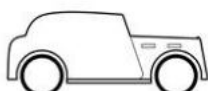
