## **Editor's Ramble**

Austin 7 Heaven — What a godsend to our members wanting to:-

- Work on their Austin 7, in a FULLY equipped workshop, AND
- Learn more about their Austin 7, and learn the variations, AND
- Get access to full workshop equipment to make or repair almost any mechanical, and car body part, AND
- Get expert training in using that equipment, OR/AND
- Obtain help, and support, from fellow members to improve/maintain/repair their vehicle.

The Editor has had his car at Austin 7 Heaven, the last few weeks, **with unstinting help**, AND ADVICE, for fixing his demolished clutch linings—such is the fate, when a 3 speed close ratio gearbox is joined by a relatively high ratio back axle and heavy touring loads.

Brian Gibbons, has solved that by sorting a 3 speed box, with just 2nd gear higher, keeps 1st gear for getting started.

So, I have a 3 speed close ratio gearbox left, same ratios as that used in an Ulster.

I had the new linings bonded to the flywheel and "clutch withdrawal plate" (using the Austin Motor Company name for that part).

Now all I need to do is get the car all reassembled.

Sounds easy, but year end stock-take, book-keeping, review of HW2024 processes, and a review of the Club's eligibility to continue to be treated as a "sporting organisation" is probably more important.

PS I refer to the Austin Motor Company "List of Spare Parts".

EVERY Austin 7 owner deserves to treat their car to a copy of the appropriate/applicable original book for their car, as it adds to your knowledge AND they are FREE.

Today I have been hard at work on my new Bathurst Racer – now some of you will say "What Humphreys? He'll never finish it!

But here I am, sitting at my keyboard, typing yet another Editorial.

The Racer is all finished, I'm sitting on it, came from Officeworks – I wore the first one out, so I splurged on a new one, BUT, *what would the Chinese know about Bathurst?*

A very small sample is summarised in a report later in this Lightshaft, by Brian Gibbons.

Short stock fan belts, for Australian cars, are being made here. Perversely, our UK providers have fan belts that suit "Home Market" cars, but, "Export" cars had a few things different, like fan belts, shockers etc. SO, we will have those short stock fan belts available very soon.

# Visit Holmesglen Tunnelling Centre 29th May 24

Seventeen members and guests attended another informative day covering behind the scenes activity making a significant contribution to the multiple civil engineering projects currently under construction in Melbourne.

After a detailed explanation using a model of the tunnelling head and the infrastructure supporting the removal of soil/rock and placing of the concrete lining we commenced a tour of all the training sections starting with onsite safety using technology to demonstrate all possible scenarios.



#### Some of the highlights:

Photo of the visiting team at the base of a drilling head (See inside back cover), demonstrates the size of the equipment and the unit in the photo is a small head others are much larger. Construction rates are two metres per day for the older and smaller units and fifteen metres per day for the larger units.

Another photo (Also inside back cover) shows the visiting team sitting in a container these are safety houses placed every fifty meters on site used in the event of danger and contain enough provisions to sustain all inside for 72 hours. The number of people in the work area cannot exceed the capacity of the containers.

There are currently ten drilling units working on multiple projects in Melbourne.

#### PAST EVENTS - HOMESGLEN

The concrete lining segments (cast in Benalla) weight ten tonnes each and are lifted into place using suction equipment. There are ten plus segments used for each section of



lining. Using hydraulic equipment each lining section is subsequently used to push the drilling head forward.

Photo shows a sample of an assembled section of tunnel, and lining segments

We were also able to see a completed section of the Metro Rail project (at the centre) complete with rail lines currently being used for fit out training mostly involving electrics.

Other sections covered were firefighting, driving earth moving equipment, setting up electric transmission lines and more.

Giving this visit was immediately after Winton and there was a limit on the number of visitors we are giving consideration to a second visit so if you would like to attend please send me a message to that effect.

# Handy Hints—Clutch aligning

#### Handy Hints - A7 Clutch alignment Tool

3 days before Winton, the flywheel on dear old 'Austenite' came loose & after the flywheel was refitted the clutch also needed re assembly.

With most cars it's relatively easy to centralize the clutch plate with the use of a stepped mandrel that fits through the clutch plate & into the flywheel.

The clutch plate in the Austin 7 however has no central hole but has the spline attached to it & a simple mandrel can't be used.

Even though I've fitted many A7 gearboxes, centralizing the clutch plate has always been difficult.

Well... problem solved with a very easy modification to a washing machine pully.

The inside diameter was bored out to be a neat sliding fit on the spline on the clutch plate.

Without removing the pulley from the lathe, to guarantee concentricity, the front side of the v belt groove was machined to fit inside the pressure plate.

3 equally spaced cut outs around 20mm wide were then cut in the rim to clear the 3 clutch operating levers.

The clutch plate is fitted into the hole in the tool & the tool with the clutch plate is fitted into the pressure plate

The whole assembly is then attached to the flywheel.

It's easy to remove the tool after the clutch assembly is fitted to the flywheel, & the clutch plate is perfectly central.

# **ARCHIVIST & CURATOR**



I know Dad would have very much appreciated the car going to an Austin enthusiast who would love, enjoy and care for the vehicle.


I have attached a feature article from the Australian Classic Car magazine from December 2012 that features Dad and his car. The car is in excellent condition
