For the Information of Members and their Guests.

Members please note:

- 1) Subject to 4) below, if applicable, your Conditional Registration allows you to drive your vehicle to and from where it's normally garaged on the events approved at a club meeting (which are published in the newsletter) including the monthly Griffith coffee runs on the first Saturday and third Wednesday.
- 2) Subject to 4) below if using your vehicle for maintenance or servicing or on longer journeys, you need to notify one of the Club's Movement Book Holders including advising of the journey's purpose. For other vehicle use you may need the approval of a Club meeting (check with a Movement Book Holder if in doubt) so early planning is desirable.
- 3) You may also use your vehicle for a funeral for a club member including a funeral procession or guard of honour.
- 4) If you have opted for Transport for NSW's Log Book Scheme you must make an entry in your log book for any maintenance or servicing or personal use trip before leaving the premises where your vehicle is garaged. You do not need to notify a Movement Book Holder in such circumstances. Using your vehicle on Club organised events does not require a log book entry as these are in addition to the number of days allotted under the Log Book Scheme.
- 5) You should check the provisions of your Comprehensive or Third Party Property Damage insurance policy for any restrictions on the use of your vehicle especially if you've opted for Transport for NSW's Log Book Scheme.

NB. It is suggested you carry this newsletter in your vehicle, together with the receipt for your membership subscription and the Certificate of Approved Operations issued by Transport for NSW as evidence of your right to drive your vehicle on public roads on the approved date in case you are questioned by the police or Transport for NSW officials. In the case of an event arranged on short notice the Secretary or a member of the Events Co-ordinating Team should be able to satisfy the authorities of the Club's decision to hold the event.

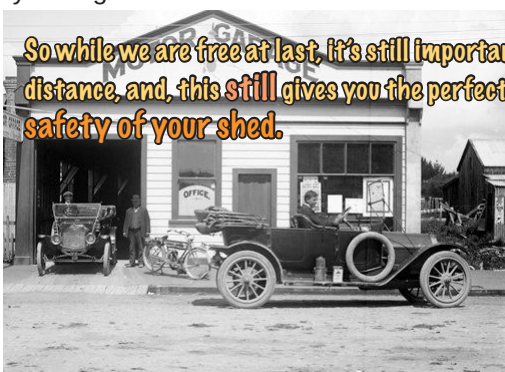

PS. The Jag to Coly and back without requiring outside assistance, much to Wally's surprise. No doubt a rare win for the British Automobile Industry!

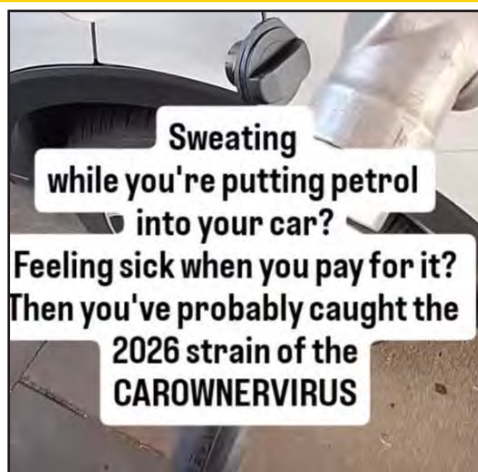

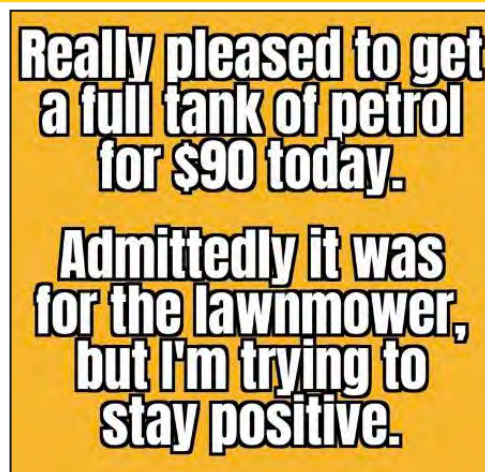

Wagga's 2026 "Cruisin' The Country Roads" Rally

The WAGGA WAGGA VETERAN AND VINTAGE MOTOR CLUB ran an annual rally on the June long weekend for more than 50 years, apart from last year.

I attended my first Wagga rally in the 1970s when it was very popular with motor cyclists who were warmed up with a Soup Stop on the Sunday morning. Sadly the number of motor cyclists dwindled and this year there were none. Nevertheless the traditional soup stop took place on Sunday morning, though its relevance was lost on many of the entrants.

This year's rally was low key to encourage Wagga's members to be involved in organising it. Apart from an entry fee entrants ordered their own meals for lunch and dinner on the Saturday and lunch on the Sunday, thereby relieving organisers of handling entrants' money as well as liaising with caterers etc. I thought it worked well and hopefully the Wagga club will be encouraged to arrange other King's Birthday weekend rallies in the future.

There were two main runs on the weekend. Saturday's was south of Wagga to either Holbrook, Culcairn, or the smaller settlements of Morven or Gerogery. I chose Culcairn, which I hadn't visited for a number of years and had a pleasant light lunch at its bakery knowing that Saturday night's dinner was at the Romano Hotel. The Wagga area has benefited from recent rains and the country was looking lush along the chosen route that covered country that was new to me. Unfortunately the hilly terrain prevented clear coverage of the ABC's top 100 from Wagga's Classic FM, though my Mercedes' 56 year old Becker radio probably didn't help. Having said that I've found that Griffith Classic FM's coverage is far superior to Wagga's, probably helped by transmission being from Mt Bingar to mainly flat country for many miles around.

We had a room to ourselves at Romano's for Saturday night's dinner and the low noise level encouraged conversation amongst entrants.

Sunday morning's run was to Ladysmith for the soup stop via a circuitous route that covered more interesting countryside. Someone judged the cars while we consumed our soup and awarded first place to a 1952 Jowett Javelin and second place to my Mercedes. The disused Wagga to Tumbarumba rail line ran through Ladysmith and a local volunteer at the former station gave interested entrants some information before we headed to lunch at Wagga's Palm and Pawn Hotel. Parking was at a premium as the place was packed with holiday weekenders and too noisy to enable meaningful conversation. The rally concluded after lunch and I was home by 4.30 that afternoon having covered 403 miles.

Ralph Baulch, who attended the rally in his Mazda, was the only other Griffith entrant. Lithgow members put us to shame as some 20 from their club attended the rally. They may have been encouraged to spend the weekend away from Lithgow which has been overrun with trucks following the closure of Victoria Pass. It seems that to cross a Lithgow intersection without traffic lights is virtually impossible.

Cam Woodside joined the GHMC a couple of years ago, after purchasing a WWII 1943 Ford Jeep off Judie Rowling. Cam had been looking for one for many years. His love of the Army jeep was a passion he shared with his long time friend, and fellow GHMC member, Lawrence Salvestrin. Both he and Lawrence regularly used their Jeeps in the Griffith Anzac Memorial Service.

Cam was a successful farmer and property investor, in partnership with his brother, David. On the farm he was the "ideas man", he was fascinated with how things worked, with a "Mr Fixit" attitude and became in charge of construction; and with David in charge of farm management, they became a very successful team. He was a bit of a Maverick, had a keen sense of humour, and a very good turn of phrase, and, a keen interest in politics. You knew exactly where he stood on any matter. Cam was a long time member of Griffith Aero Club, owning his own Cessna 182, and a very keen golfer, serving on the committees of both clubs.
